PHS SEPTEMBER 15 MEETING TO FEATURE PROGRAM ON ROSIE THE RIVETER/WORLD WAR II PARK

ational Park Ranger and Outreach Specialist Lucien Sonder will present a talk and sideshow about the historical significance of the Rosie the Riveter/World War II Home Front National Historical Park in Richmond at the Pinole Historical Society on Thursday, September 15.

The park preserves and interprets the stories and places of our nation's home front response to World War II.

The meeting will be held in the Alex Clark Community Room of the Pinole Public Safety Facility, 880 Tennent Avenue, starting at 6:30 p.m.

Ranger Sonder will review the major themes and land-



marks of the park, including the SS Red Oak Victory Ship, which was built in the Richmond Shipyards in 1944, the 1931 Ford Assembly Building, which was converted to assemble tanks and jeeps during World War II, the Rosie the Riveter Memorial, dedicated in 2000 as a monument to the women who worked on the home front, and the Maritime Child Development Center, which served the children of shipyard workers.

Ranger Sonder holds a master's degree in historic preservation from Columbia University.

RICHMOND MUSEUM CELEBRATES "RICHMOND DAY" AT 1915 PANAMA PACIFIC INTERNATIONAL EXPOSITION

he Richmond Museum of History will premiere a new exhibit commemorating "Richmond Day at the Panama Pacific International Exposition, San Francisco, August 7, 1915," which celebrated the 10th anniversary of Richmond's incorporation as a city.

The exhibit premieres Sunday, August 7. Richmond was incorporated on that date in 1905.

The museum, at 400 Nevin

Avenue, will host an opening reception from 1-3 p.m. on August 7. This free event is open to the public. The exhibition will be on display through October 1 in the museum's Seaver Gallery.

The Panama Pacific international Exposition was built on a 635-acre plot of land along San Francisco's northern shore (now the Marina District). On August 7, 1915, the exposition held "Richmond Day." Hundreds of

Richmond residents were ferried to the exposition. There was a parade and special exhibits about Richmond.

Held only nine years after the city had been almost entirely destroyed by the great earthquake and fire of 1906, the exposition not only helped get San Francisco back on its feet, but boosted the morale of the entire Bay Area.



National Park Service to Host Summer Campfire Programs at John Muir National Historic Site

"My fire was in all its glory about midnight... I had nothing to do but look and listen and join the trees in their hymns and prayers." -- John Muir, Travels in Alaska

Join the National Park Service for two free campfire programs on Friday, August 5 and Saturday, August 6, 2011 at John Muir National Historic Site in Martinez, CA. Both programs will begin shortly before sunset at 7:30 PM and will last 1.5 hours. Rangers will lead the group in songs, skits and stories to celebrate the legacy of John Muir, one of the greatest conservationists the United States has ever known.

Created in 1964, John Muir NHS preserves the home, landscapes, and grave site of conservationist and national park advocate John Muir. Muir, born in Scotland, spent his entire life exploring, studying, and writing about his experiences in the American wilderness. He travelled throughout the world, but most notably in the Sierra Nevada Mountains, and he considered Yosemite to be one of the most beautiful places he had ever lived. Before he passed away in 1914, he advocated for the preservation of five American national parks, and set the stage for a conservation movement that would change the face of this country and later earn Muir the title: "Father of the National Parks."

Meet at the front gate of the John Muir National Historic Site, 4202 Alhambra Ave, in Martinez, CA (at the Alhambra Ave. exit off Highway 4). Bring the whole family, picnic blankets, lawn chairs, and a desire to have a good time. Rangers will direct you from the gate to the fire ring, which will be under a small grove of redwood trees. If it rains heavily, the program will be canceled.
