PINOLE'S HISTORY OF FLOODS REMEMBERED

On April 2, 1958, a fierce early spring storm that had dropped buckets of rain on the city for several days caused a swollen Pinole Creek to overflow, turning downtown Pinole streets into navigable waterways.

This was the latest of several massive Pinole Creek floods in the city's history. It caused the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to begin a lengthy project to ensure the creek wouldn't overflow again.

Why did Pinole Creek overflow and how did civil engineers solve this problem?

This free program will begin at 10 a.m., with craft projects running until 1 p.m. The Valentine crafts will use recycled and everyday house-

hold items, similar to crafts that children used to make during the World War II years.

Reservations are not required for this event, and families are welcome to drop in anytime during the program. All items for craft projects will be provided. All children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Kids and parents are reminded to wear clothing that they do not mind getting dirty.

Participants are invited to take a lunch break and return for a ranger-led program at 3 p.m. "Love



During Wartime" will teach visitors about love stories and long-distance relationships during World War II. This 45minute program will be held in the same building as the craft event. Seating is on a first come, first served basis.

WOMEN PLAY LEADING ROLES IN WWII FILM SERIES

he National Park Service and the Richmond Museum Association announce a new film festival series aboard the SS Red Oak Victory, a beautifully restored cargo ship built in Richmond during World War II. The ship is owned and operated by the Richmond Museum Association and is also part of Rosie the Riveter/ WWII Home Front National Historical Park. Admission to the films is free, but there is a suggested donation of \$10 to help preserve and maintain the ship.

Four movies will be screened on

Tuesdays as part of the "Women on the Home Front and Beyond Film Series." Boarding begins at 6:30 PM and the films begin at 7 PM.

Tuesday, February 17: So Proudly We Hail (1943). Veronica Lake and Claudette Colbert are army nurses serving in the Philippines during the early days of WWII.

Tuesday, March 17: *Shining Through* (1992). Starring Melanie Griffith and Michael Douglas. Griffith plays a brave woman who goes undercover in Germany for the Allies to discover the secrets of the V2 rocket. This film is rated R; no one under 17



will be admitted without a parent. **Tuesday, April 14:** Force of Arms (1951). William

Holden, a soldier, and Nancy Olson, a nurse, find love during war.

Tuesday, May 12: *The Josephine Baker Story* (1991). Ingénue and ex-pat Josephine Baker stays in France during WWII and helps Jews escape the Nazis. This film is rated R; no one under 17 will be admitted without a parent.

The SS Red Oak Victory is located in historic Shipyard #3 at 1337 Canal Blvd., Berth 6A, in Richmond. For directions to the

shipyard, visit the Red Oak Victory website at *www.ssredoakvictory.com/contact.htm*.

Please note: The ship is not ADA accessible. Visitors must be able to climb the gangplank (40 feet of stairs with railings) and steep steps once aboard. Remember to wear warm clothing, as it can be chilly aboard the ship! Inclement weather may force the ship staff to cancel this program for safety reasons.

If it rains, please call the ship at 510-237-2933 by 5:30 PM on the day of the screening to find out if the show will go on.


LOCAL HISTORY BOOKS AVAILABLE FROM THE PINOLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

You may purchase one or more of these books from us at the Pinole Farmers' Market—we'll be there every other Saturday through the end of December.







