THE LOST CITIES OF THE EAST BAY

Lost to the annals of history is the small town of Tormey that once existed in the upper northwest corner of Contra Costa County, California, near both San Pablo Bay and the Carquinez Strait, barely two miles from the town of Rodeo.

While the name Tormey still appears on maps of the San Francisco Bay Area, today it is for the most part long abandoned, vacant land. It was at one time, however, a cozy company town that was home to hundreds of families over the course of nearly a century.

Author John Robinson will explore the history of the long-lost cities of Tormey, Selby,



Oleum, Valona, Eckley, and Port Costa, and Vallejo Junction, among others, in his February 2, 2018, program, *"The Lost Cities of the East Bay."*

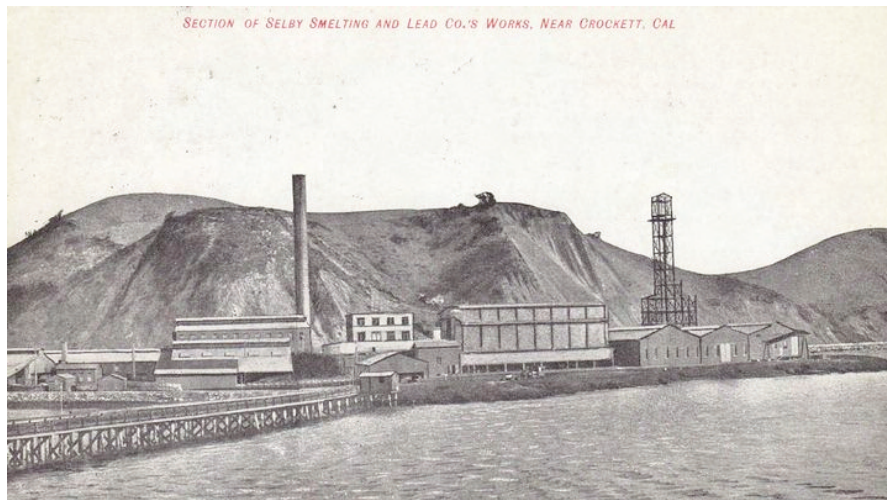

“The title of my talk is ‘Lost Cities of the East Bay,’ but the focus is south side of the Carquinez Strait from the Port Costa Brick Works in the east to Point Pinole in the west,” Robinson says. “I use the word ‘cities’ for brevity; these places were never cities, nor even towns. At best they were villages, a collection of ferry and train stops, hotels, stores, company houses, and, mostly, saloons, that sprang up around the factories and plants of the early twentieth century.”

Robinson's talk will include photos and comments about:

- The Port Costa Brick Works;
- Waterfront Port Costa during the age of the ferries;
- Eckley as a brick works, a fishing resort, and now a regional park;
- Vallejo Junction a ferry terminal west of Crockett that brought people to South Vallejo and was mentioned in a Robert Louis Stevenson story;
- The Selby Smelting Plant (photo above);
- Tormey;
- Oleum, a tiny community that sprang up around the Standard Oil Refinery near Rodeo;
- The Hercules Powder Works; and
- The Atlas Powder Works at Giant.

“Most of these places are long gone, or absorbed into larger communities,” Robinson says. “But, they all are interesting footnotes to our local history.”

PHS SELLING NEW BOOK ABOUT EAST BAY HILLS

The Pinole Historical Society has a limited number of copies of the new book, *East Bay Hills: A Brief History*, published by Arcadia Publishing.

Author Amelia Sue Marshall lives on Peralta Creek in Oakland. She developed a passionate interest in the history of the East Bay redwoods while riding her mare there as a trail safety patrol volunteer for the East Bay Regional Park District.

Her previous careers as a journalist, space science engineer, planetarium lecturer, and real estate broker have been cast aside in favor of writing about local history.

She is a board member of the Metropolitan Horsemen's Association and the Oakland Heritage Alliance.

Here's a description of the book, provided by Arcadia Publishing:

Like the mist rising from San Francisco Bay encircles the towering redwoods, the little-known legends of the East Bay Hills enrich a glorious history.

Follow the trails of Saclan and Jalquin-Yrgin people over the hills and through the valleys. Ride with the mounted rangers through the Flood of '62. Break

into a sealed railroad tunnel with a pack of junior high school boys. Learn how university professors, civil servants and wealthy businessmen planned for years to create a chain of parks twenty miles along the hilltops.

Author Amelia Sue Marshall explores the heritage of these storied parklands with the naturalists who continue to preserve them and the old-timers who remember wilder days.

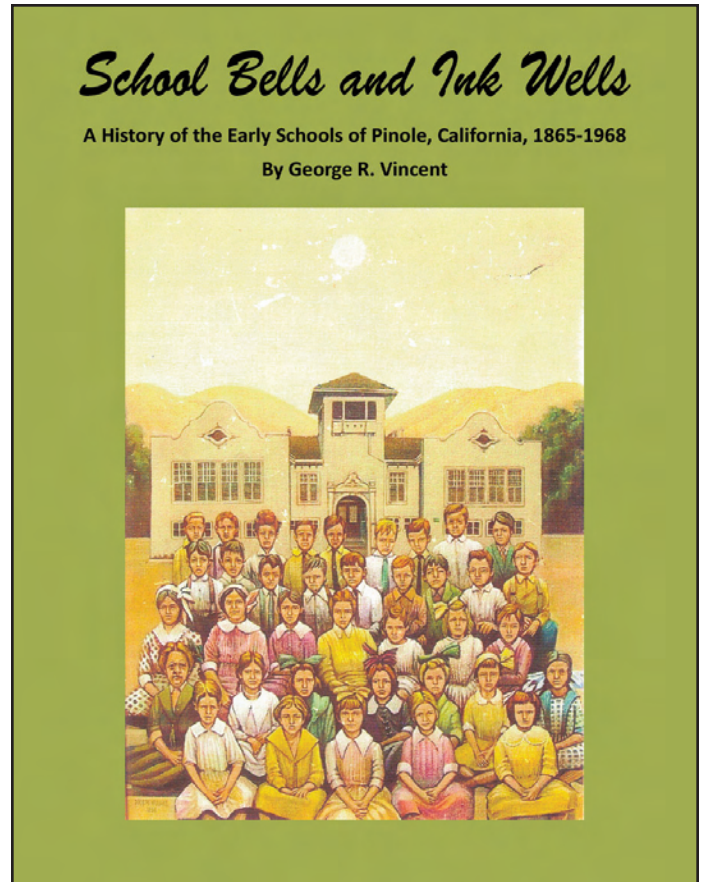

There is a shared pride of camaraderie understood only by those who bore the trials of the daily uphill climb to the creaking stairs and dark halls haunted by the strict stares of lurking teachers.

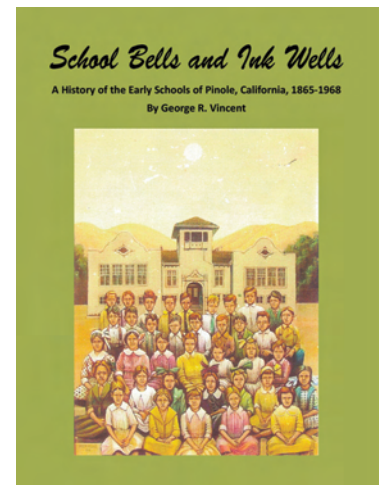

DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY OF SERVICE EVENT AT SAN FRANCISCO MARITIME NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK

Join the National Park Service and partners on Monday, January 15, for a day of special events celebrating the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

"Through Our Voices: Get the Word Out!" will feature a panel of African American rangers presenting stories of African American struggles and triumphs connected to Bay Area national parks in the Maritime Museum Building at 900 Beach Street, San Francisco, from 10:30 AM-12:30 PM.

Panelists will include Betty Reid Soskin (Rosie the Riveter/WWII Home Front National Historical Park), Benny Batom (Alcatraz), NoeMesha Williams (San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park), Rik Penn (Presidio/Golden Gate National Recreation Area) and Kelli English (Port Chicago Naval Magazine National Memorial).

Historian John Templeton, founder of the African American Freedom Trail in San Francisco, will moderate the panel and frame these stories within the context of Dr. King's work.

Following a break for refreshments, the program will continue at 2 PM with poetry and song. San Francisco native poet and activist Tongo Eisen-Martin will read from his work (Mr. Eisen-Martin's

second poetry collection was published in 2017 by City Lights, and his poem, "The Confidence Scheme," recently appeared in the New York Times Magazine). Warming up the stage for Mr. Eisen-Martin will be poets James Cagney and Zack Hansen. To wrap up the event, ranger Frederik Penn will sing popular standards from the African American songbook, accompanied by a jazz ensemble.

Admission to this event is free, however reservations are required. Please reserve your seat at <http://tinyurl.com/SAFRMLK2018>. Seating is first come, first served, but your ticket guarantees a seat. Venue doors will open at 10 AM on the day of the program. Although visitors of all ages are welcome, high school students and teachers are especially invited to attend this program on their day off from school.

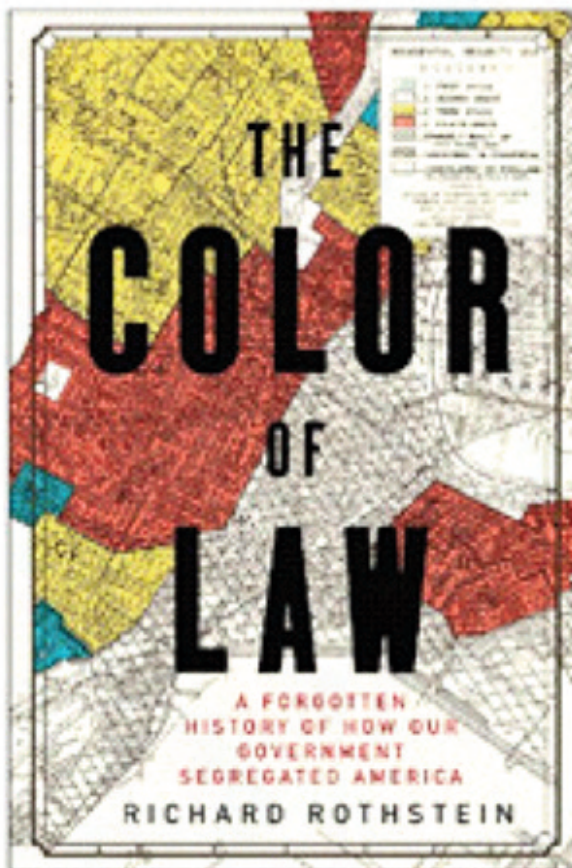

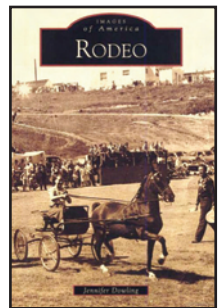
LOCAL HISTORY BOOKS AVAILABLE FROM THE PINOLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

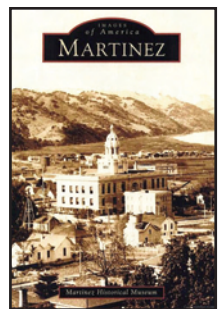
The Pinole, Hercules, Richmond,

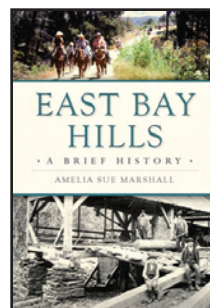

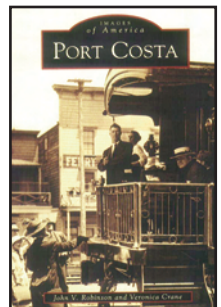

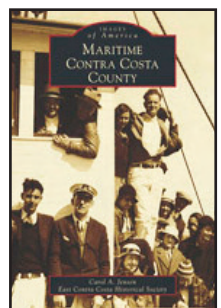

Flag Holidays

Every year we see more American flags being displayed for community and special events.

On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed the Flag Resolution which stated: "Resolved, that the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Francis Hopkinson, of New Jersey, a naval flag designer and a signer of the Declaration of Independence, designed the 1777 flag.

The original flag has been modified 26 times and was unchanged with its 48 stars for 47 years, beginning with Arizona's and New Mexico's admittance to the Union on July 4, 1912. On January 3, 1959, when Alaska was admitted to the Union, the number of stars increased to 49. On August 21, 1959, when Hawaii was admitted to the Union, the flag showed 50 stars.

- D-Day (June 6)
- Flag Day (June 14)
- Father's Day (Third Sunday in June)
- Independence Day (July 4)
- Korean War Veterans Day (July 27)
- V-J Day (September 2)
- Labor Day (First Monday in September)
- Patriot Day (September 11; half staff all day)
- Constitution Day (September 17)
- Gold Star Mothers Day (September 27)
- Columbus Day (Oct. 12)
- Navy Day (October 27)
- Election Day (First Tuesday in November)
- Veterans Day (Nov. 11)
- Thanksgiving Day (Fourth Thursday in November)
- Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day (December 7; half staff all day)
- Christmas Day (Dec. 25)

Other flag holidays include Inauguration Day (every four years), election days, state and local holidays, Admission Day, and others proclaimed by the President of the United States.
