PHS WILL PUBLISH NEW BOOK IN FALL 2015

he Pinole Historical Society will see its second book on the history of Pinole published in the fall of 2015.


The society has a signed a contract with Fonthill Media (*www.fonthillmedia.com/*), a specialist book-publishing company in the areas of general history, local and regional history, military history, transport history, and biography.

The society will be producing *Pinole Through Time*, a title in Fonthill's *America Through Time* series. The book will feature photos of old Pinole buildings and landmarks and current photos of what exists on those sites today. In several cases it will be the same building, some restored and others nearly identical.

Fonthill Media publishes in the USA, UK, France, and Spain. Its titles are published simultaneously as printed books and e-books and supplied to the general book trade. Most titles are aimed at general readership level, but with a more specialist, or in-depth focus on the subject matter in hand.

DON CASTRO CELEBRATED AT PINOLE YOUTH CENTER EVENT

he life of Don Castro was celebrated July 28 during a short ceremony and the unveiling of a plaque in his honor at the Pinole Youth Center, 635 Tennent Avenue. The plaque is on the wall at the entrance to the building.

Don was a Pinole native, community activist, and local businessman. He died August 29, 2013. He was 76.

Don was a graduate of Richmond Union High School, served in the

U.S. Navy, and was energetic in promoting Pinole as a great place to live and dine. In 1968, he and a partner opened the popular C&C Continental Deli on San Pablo Avenue. For 35 years Don, his wife Ida, and family treated Pinoleans to their specialties of family style meals seasoned with Don's humor and Ida's cheerful smiles.

Don's continual pride in Pinole was reflected in his tireless charitable and civic-minded works in such



organizations as the Pinole Youth Foundation, Pinole Jaycees, and Rotary, Lions, and Exchange clubs, among others.

He dedicated himself to giving the young people of Pinole a voice and place in their community. His efforts on the Pinole Youth Foundation resulted in the city saving the old downtown Bank of Pinole building as the Pinole Youth Center, before the current youth center was built.

If a person's life can

be measured by the many who loved and befriended him along the way, Don certainly met and exceeded the test. His standing-room-only memorial service was testimony to the fact that he personally knew everybody in town and out.

Don was a rare individual who could always count the number of his friends by the population figures on the city's "Welcome to Pinole" signs.

Essay-contest winners shine in school competition

ore than 150 students in five Pinole schools participated in the Fifth Annual Pinole Historical Society Essay Contest this year.

Students were asked to write an essay of no more than 250 words answering this question: "What would you like Pinole to be like 25 years from now?" Students at Collins, Ellerhorst, and Shannon elementary schools, St. Joseph School, and Pinole Valley High School participated.

The PHS received some very interesting responses, everything

from flying robots and flying cars, to requests for more parks, more police, more restaurants, more things for kids to do, and requests from several young students for people to become more involved in the community.

Shannon Elementary School fourth-grader Isaac Castaneda won the contest for the third time. He previously won as a first- and third-grader.

On June 2, Pinole Mayor Tim Banuelos presented certificates of achievement and 10 grand prizes (Target gift certificates), to students who wrote the best essays at each of the elementary schools and St. Joseph School. PVHS students had previously received certificates.



6th annual Home Front Film Festival summer schedule

osie the Riveter/World War II Home Front National Historical Park and the Richmond Museum of History Association continues its 6th Annual WWII Home Front Film Festival on Thursdays in July and August.

The film festival features popular, full-length movies that were shown on the Home Front during the WWII period.

The movies will be screened aboard the S.S. Red Oak Victory, a beautifully restored ship built in Richmond during World War II. The ship is located in historic Shipyard #3 (1337 Canal Blvd., Berth 6A. Richmond), where thousands of Americans labored to build 747 ships over the course of the war. National Park Service Ranger Craig Riordan, who picks the movies and introduces them, tells stories about the stars or about the times and circumstances of the making of each movie, adding to the pleasure of seeing them.

Boarding is at 6:30 p.m. and the films begin at 7. There is a requested donation to board the ship and enjoy ship exhibits prior to the film. Please note: the ship is not ADA accessible. Visitors must be able to

climb a gangplank (40 feet of stairs with railings) and steep steps once aboard ship.

Popcorn and refreshments will be available for purchase.

- Thursday, July 10: Casablanca (1942), starring Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman. A Home Front Film Festival tradition. Come dressed as your favorite character from the movie! • Thursday, July 24: Across the
- Pacific (1942), starring Humphrey Bogart and Mary Astor. Is Bogey a traitor, or the only chance to save the world's most important waterway from the treachery of the Japanese?
- Thursday, August 7: A Guy Named Joe (1943), starring Spencer

Tracy and Van Johnson. Tracy is a reckless bomber pilot stationed in England who finds himself in the role of guardian angel to a new pilot, played by Van Johnson.

• Thursday, August 21: Harvey (1950), starring James Stewart and Josephine Hull. This film was based on the Pulitzer Prize-winning play written by Mary Chase. Ms. Chase wrote this play to lift the spirits of a neighbor who lost her son in the Pacific Theater during World War II. Come and get your spirits lifted, too.

refusal of 50 of the surviving sailors to resume loading munitions until their safety could be assured resulted in the most significant mutiny trial in our history. Their cause, supported by Eleanor Roosevelt and Thurgood Marshall, contributed to the desegregation of ilitary.

In July 1944, the largest U.S. mainland explosion of World War II destroyed the Navy's Port Chicago Magazine (now called the Military Ocean Terminal Concord), instantly killing 202 African American sailors working in a segregated munitions loading crew. An additional 118 merchant marines, other military personnel, and civilians also died. Hundreds more were wounded.

the Navy and later the entire military.

Port Chicago Naval Magazine National Memorial was created by Congress in 1994 by legislation authored by Congressman George Miller (D-Martinez) and signed by President Bill Clinton. On October 28, 2009, President Barack Obama signed into law a bill authored by Congressman Miller that made the memorial a full and permanent unit of the National Park System.






PUBLIC COMMEMORATION EVENT AND TOURS OF S.S. RED OAK VICTORY

A public commemoration of the 70th anniversary of the Port Chicago disaster is scheduled for Saturday, July 19, from 10 a.m. to noon, at Shipyard #3 of the historic Kaiser Shipyards, where the S.S. Red Oak Victory is permanently moored. The Red Oak Victory is of the same class of ship lost in the Port Chicago explosion in 1944.


In addition to ship tours, this event will feature Port Chicago films and presentations in commemoration of the disaster and its aftermath. The commemoration is free and open to the public. Visitors will be able to board and tour the Red Oak Victory, but the ship is not accessible to people with mobility limitations.





You may purchase one or more of these books from us at the Pinole Farmers' Market—we'll be there every other Saturday through the end of December.






