



In memoríam

DAVID W. CLARK February 13, 1941 – May 10, 2018 Age 77

A Celebration of Life will be held rom 3:30-6:30 p.m. Sunday, July 8, at the Pinole Senior Center, 2500 Charles Ave., to honor the life and memory of Dave Clark, who died May 10.

David William Clark, better known as Mr. Clark, was born February 13, 1941, in Richmond to Roy and Ava Clark. He is survived by his wife Patti, children Laurie Klavins, (Eric), Anjee Gallia, (Jason), Stacy Norgaard, and grandchildren Dylan, Brendan, Gina, Liliana and Giana.

He was the grandson of journalist Jesse Howe Clark, who, as Pinole's official historian and poet

laureate, chronicled the city's history as a writer and editor of the *Pinole Weekly Times* and *Pinole-Hercules News* for half a century.

Mr. Clark followed in his father's footsteps and spent 30+ years as a volunteer fireman for the City of Pinole. He retired in 1988 with the title of Captain. He was a member of the first class to graduate from De Anza High School in 1958.

Mr. Clark began his teaching and directing career at Castlemont High School in Oakland from 1963-1967 before joining the staff of the newly opened Pinole Valley High School. He taught English, Theater, and Technical Theater, and directed full-scale productions at PVHS until his retirement in 2003.

In addition to his 39 years of

teaching, Mr. Clark was the founder of the Pinole Young Actors in 1968 and the City of Pinole's School of Performing Arts in 2003. He was also a founding member — along with his wife, Patti, and Gary and Nancy Gill — of the Pinole Community Players in 1986, and had served on its Board since then.

In the late 1960s, David planted the seed with Tom Malinowski, Pinole's Recreation Director, to provide a Pinole Young Actors drama summer program. The program grew from 45 students to 120 each summer. This year the program celebrates 50 years providing

a children's drama program for ages 7-14. His daughter, Stacy, is the director/coordinator, and will

be directing this year's production, The Lion King Jr. Experience, along with his daughter, Anjee.

He was the guiding light in the creation of the West County Conservatory of the Arts Program, a school within a school aiding student involved in drama, music, dance, fine arts, photography, and debate. Without his dedication students would be unable to take additional classes in their area of interest.

In 1997, at a surprise celebration honoring his contributions to the drama students of PVHS, former students from all over the United States gathered to celebrate his 30 years of achievements at Pinole Valley High School. That was quite a testament.

David Clark spent his entire life spreading the joy of theatre in our community. He shared his knowledge and love for theatre with everyone he met. He will be forever in the hearts of all those fortunate to have known him, learned from him, laughed with him, and loved him.

In lieu of flowers, donations to the David Clark Memorial Fund may be made to the Pinole Community Players (P.O. Box 182, Pinole, CA 94564) to provide scholarships to community youth for participation in youth theater programs.





The book brings to light the workings and people that made the Pinole-Hercules Union School District the envy of surrounding townships.





Flag Holidays

Livery year we see more American flags being displayed for community and special events.

On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed the Flag Resolution which stated: "Resolved, that the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Francis Hopkinson, of New Jersey, a naval flag designer and a signer of the Declaration of Independence, designed the 1777 flag.

The original flag has been modified 26 times and was unchanged with its 48 stars for 47 years, beginning with Arizona's and New Mexico's admittance to the Union on July 4, 1912. On January 3, 1959, when Alaska was admitted to the Union, the number of stars increased to 49. On August 21, 1959, when Hawaii was admitted to the Union, the flag showed 50 stars.

- Memorial Day (Last Monday in May; half-staff until noon)
- · D-Day (June 6)
- Flag Day (June 14)
- Father's Day (Third Sunday in June)

- Independence Day (July 4)
- Korean War Veterans Day (July 27)
- V-J Day (September 2)
- · Labor Day (First Monday in September)
- Patriot Day (September 11; half staff all day)
- Constitution Day September 17)
- · Gold Star Mothers Day (September 27)
- Columbus Day (Oct. 12)
- · Navy Day (October 27)
- Election Day (First Tuesday in November)
- · Veterans Day (Nov. 11)
- Thanksgiving Day (Fourth Thursday in November)
- Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day (December 7; half staff all day)
- Christmas Day (Dec. 25)

Other flag holidays include Inauguration Day (every four years), election days, state and local holidays, Admission Day, and others proclaimed by the President of the United States.
