

PHS TO PRESENT PROGRAM AT PINOLE SENIOR CENTER


he Pinole Historical Society will take its "museum on wheels" to the Pinole Senior Center on Wednesday, March 9, for a 1:30 p.m. program during the center's monthly membership meeting.

Presenting "Things Never Change in Pinole ... Or Do They?" will be PHS co-founder George Vincent, the society's historian, current vice president, and co-author of the recently published book "Pinole Through Time."

The program will feature some never-beforeseen photos (at least not by anyone who is alive today!), and stories based on photos from the book, which features old photos — some dating back to the 19th century — and current photos showing the same locations.

PHS essay contest encourages students to explore city's history

In memoriam



LOVIE L. AMOS September 6, 1920 — February 10, 2016

Lovie Amos, a lifetime member of the Pinole Historical Society, died February 10. She was 95.

Lovie had lived in Pinole since 1953. She was the only woman on a seven-person crew at one of the Richmond shipyards during WWII. She was an employee of the East Bay Municipal Utility District for 36 years and was the first woman appointed by the EBMUD Board of Directors as a division manager.

She was most proud of being named among the top 400 women in the country listed in Who's Who of American Women.

Lovie Amos

REBECCA GUTIERREZ September 12, 1940 — January 18, 2016

Rebecca Gutierrez, a lifetime member of the Pinole Historical Society and a former PHS vice president, died January 18 in Las Vegas. She was 75.

Rebecca and another PHS lifetime member, Gail Snyder-Von Aspern, were responsible for setting up the Pinole history displays at Pinole City Hall.

Rebecca was formerly Becky Kanalz, an older movie actress with a host of movies to her credit. She was also a U.S. Navy nurse and then an RN in the private sector for the remainder of that career until she retired nine years ago.

She moved to Las Vegas and decided to get back into the movies. At her death she had just finished filming a movie with Nicholas Cage.


Come see, touch, and learn about reptiles. The program includes tarantulas, frogs, and a giant monitor lizard (photo, right).

PHS PROGRAMS SET FOR MAY, SEPTEMBER

e have several interesting programs lined up this year. Our focus will be not only on Pinole history, but the history of the region. We have scheduled programs for our May 13 and September 9 meetings. We'll announce our November 4 program as we move closer of that date.

Here are our scheduled programs all from 6:30 to 8 p.m. in conference rooms 2A and 2B of the Kaiser Permanente Medical Office Building, 1301 Pinole Valley Road:

May 13: The Contra Costa County Historical Society (CCCHS) operates a major archival collection documenting the history of the county at its Contra Costa History Center at 724 Escobar Street, in Martinez. CCCHS representatives will describe the collection, consisting of letters, diaries, manuscripts of writings, legal records, photographs, maps, newspapers, periodicals, and books.

September 9: Beverly Lane, former mayor of Danville and curator of the Museum of the San Ramon Valley, will speak about the history of the San Ramon Valley, which has many parallels to the history of West Contra Costa County. Beverly is the author of the recently published book, *San Ramon Chrinocles: Stories of Bygone Days*.

On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed the Flag Resolution which stated: "Resolved, that the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Francis Hopkinson, of New Jersey, a naval flag designer and a signer of the Declaration of Independence, designed the 1777 flag.

The original flag has been modified 26 times and was unchanged with its 48 stars for 47 years, beginning with Arizona's and New Mexico's admittance to the Union on July 4, 1912. On January 3, 1959, when Alaska was admitted to the Union, the number of stars increased to 49. On August 21, 1959, when Hawaii was admitted to the Union, the flag showed 50 stars.

Other flag holidays include Inauguration Day (every four years), election days, state and local holidays, Admission Day, and others proclaimed by the President of the United States.



SAN FRANCISCO MARITIME NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK LAUNCHES ONLINE SALE OF PARK PASSES

Visitors can pre-purchase passes and store them on their mobile devices

he National Park Service (NPS) has launched a pilot program to make entrance passes for San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park (SAFR) available for sale through visitors' smartphones.

Visitors to the Park now have the convenience of purchasing — at no additional cost — SAFR annual and seven-day entrance passes using a free mobile app (the app currently runs on iOS, and will soon be available for Android). The app is available from the park's website at www.nps.gov/safr/planyourvisit/fees.htm.

"Today, many of San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park's potential visitors, especially Millennials—the next generation of national park visitors—conduct business on mobile devices," said Superintendent

Kevin Hendricks. "We want to make it as easy to experience your national park as buying a cup of coffee!"

The park's authorized pass vendor, Viply LLC, has created an app that allows park visitors to pre-purchase an entrance pass and skip the long ticketing lines by quickly scanning a Quick Response (QR) code at the park's entrance booth.

The electronic version of the seven-day park pass or park annual pass is also convenient—it can't get lost or misplaced because it resides on the visitor's own mobile device. The pass is non-transferrable, non refundable, non replaceable and should be available on visitors' smartphones at all times while in the park.

The annual entrance pass fee for San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park is \$40, and seven-day entrance passes are \$10. Children 15 years or younger accompanied by an adult do not need an entry ticket. Entrance fees are also not charged to holders of the America the Beautiful pass series including – the National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Annual, Senior, Access, Every Kid in a Park 4th Grade, or Military Pass.

"We are excited to be working with the San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park and provide a convenient, hassle-free app enabling visitors to access park passes in advance, by-pass ticketing lines and immediately enjoy all of the park's amenities," said John Masterson, co-founder and president of Viply.

San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park is located at the west end of Fisherman's Wharf in San Francisco. The park includes a fleet of National Historic Landmark ships, a visitor center, a maritime museum, a public maritime research center, and the Aquatic Park Historic District.

In celebration of the 100th anniversary of the National Park Service in 2016, the park seeks to connect with and create the next generation of park visitors, supporters and advocates and invites visitors to join in celebrating its centennial milestone.
