Popular presentation given for second time


The Pinole Historical Society's well-received genealogy program—


Jennifer and Stephen, plus many of the

PHS, PINOLE LIBRARY PRESERVE CITY'S HISTORY

he Pinole Historical Society and the Pinole Library are united in their efforts to preserve the city's history—and present it to the public

For the list year and a half, the library has offered the PHS the use of two large display cases, in which the society rotates historical exhibits.

The current exhibits celebrate Hational Preservation Month (May) and Phole winners of Hational Women's History Month (Harch) awards.

The next exhibit, in June, will feature winners of our annual essay contest in Pinole schools.

For a historical society without a museum, the library's generosity gives us an opportunity to present the city's history to the public

Recently, librarians Ian Richards and Tim Madigan asked the PMS to provide photos for the library's previously bare brick walls. We were happy to oblige; now, 23 photos of Phole's past

are hanging on the library's walls. Included among these are several school class photos between 1889 and the 1930s, which
