Dr. Joe to be honored at November 11 dinner


he Pinole Historical Society is having two events on Sunday, November 11, that are of considerable interest to Pinole residents.

November 11 is Veterans Day. This year the PHS will conduct is 5th Annual Veterans Day Memorial and Flag Retirement Ceremony at 11 a.m. in Fernandez Park.

And, later that afternoon, from 5 to 8 p.m. at the Pinole Senior Center, the society will honor Dr. Joseph Mariotti, co-founder of the Pinole Historical Society, with a lifetime achievement award. We're calling this event "Joe's Party."

Dr. Joe's civic achievements are numerous. As an orthopaedic surgeon, he was the team physician for Pinole Valley High School for 32 years.

He is a longtime environmentalist and conservationist who has served on the Save Contra Costa Shoreline Committee, Hercules Environmental



Resources Committee, Urban Creek Council, East Bay Regional Parks Advisory Committee, Contra Costa County Plastic Recycling Advisory Committee, Coastal Clean-Up, West Contra Costa Environmental Education Committee, and the Friends of Pinole Creek Watershed.

And, he was a member of the Contra Costa County Historical Landmarks Advisory Committee from 2003-2010.

Dr. Joe is also a member of the Pinole Garden Club, which honored him with a ceremony on March 22, 2011, by planting a Crape

Myrtle tree in his honor at Bayfront Park.

How about important athletic events, such as a high-school football, basketball, baseball, softball, or volleyball game?

Perhaps you have film of an important event that took place in Fernandez Park, or a ribbon cutting or an event that has a place in Pinole's history — such as the 1958 flood?

We're looking for any video or film you have — VHS, Beta, camcorder, DV tape, 8mm, Super 8mm, 16mm, 35mm, motion picture.

We want to collect, digitize, catalog, and preserve old movies on DVD (and whatever formats are to come) to exhibit, educate, and entertain.

The PHS will share these videos on a film archive that we will establish, similar to the The Pioneers Film Archive on YouTube created by the California Pioneers of Santa Clara (www.youtube.com/sccpioneers).

Mystery Postcards from the California Delta

Local author releases new book featuring stunning collection of vintage postcards

San Francisco, California – September 10, 2012 – Everyone loves a good mystery especially when it is in one's own back yard!

Author Carol Jensen, the Brentwood Press and the East Contra Costa Historical Society team to learn more about the families, successes and lives of early East Contra Costa County pioneers. Local residents are challenged to identify people and locations throughout the community as captured in postcard images from the early 20th Century. The response is insightful, often witty, and illustrates the interesting lives of emigrants settling the beautiful California Delta.

Presented in Challenge and Solution format, readers are asked to share their insights regarding the postcard image, sender or recipient. Responses are gathered, sifted and presented in subsequent newspaper editions. This compilation of 15 postcard-inspired articles was a monthly feature of the Brentwood Press from 2010 to 2012.

Mystery Postcards from the California Delta depicts life in small town California and provides insights into early 20th Century life. Postcard collectors, mystery sleuths, and social/cultural history enthusiasts will enjoy revisiting life as it was experienced the past century. The *Brentwood Press* and East Contra Costa Historical Society are pleased to play a part in preserving local heritage.

The book is available at the East Contra Costa Historical Society Museum, area bookstores, independent retailers, on-line retailers, and eBay. A portion of the proceeds are contributed to the East Contra Costa Historical Society.





You may purchase one or more of these books from us at the Pinole Farmers' Market—we'll be there every other Saturday through the end of December.






