### BOOK-SIGNING, 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF BANK OF PINOLE, AN EVENT TO REMEMBER

he Pinole Historical Society celebrated the publication of its new book, *Pinole Through Time*, written by PHS board members Jeff Rubin and George Vincent, and the 100th anniversary of the Bank of Pinole building, on Friday, October 2, inside the Bank of Pinole, with a catered party and book-signing.

The event featured short speeches by Edward M. Downer III, grandson of former mayor of Pinole Edward M. Downer, who built the Bank of Pinole building in 1915, and George Vincent, who gave an impassioned plea for the establishment of a museum in Pinole, preferably

in the Bank of Pinole building.

The JewelTones, an a cappella chorus from Palo Alto, sang songs from the 1930s and 1940s.

Pinole Through Time contains 192 old and new comparative photographs showing how Pinole changed through the 19th and 20th centuries and into the 21st century.

There are detailed and extensive captions packed with historical information accompanying each photograph.

Following Jeff Rubin will be tours of the County archives. Take advantage of this special opportunity to see how CCCHS preserves delicate records and special collections.



he eighth annual Veterans Day Memorial and Flag Retirement Ceremony will begin at 11 a.m. on Nov. 11, in Fernandez Park. The event will feature Boy Scout Troop 86, West Contra Costa Girl Scouts, Veterans of Foreign Wars, St. Joseph School students and choir, the Pinole Valley High School Marching Band, Pinole Youth Commissioners, and elected officials.

# PHS will present author of new book about the 1915 Panama-Pacific International Exposition



### THE WORLD WAR II ENEMY ALIEN PROGRAM AND LESSONS FOR TODAY

### A series uncovering the treatment of German, Italian, and Japanese immigrants during World War II

n Saturday, October 24 and November 14 at 11 AM, the Rosie The Riveter/World War II Home Front National Historical Park will host the second and third programs in a three-part series uncovering the treatment of "enemy alien" immigrants in the U.S. and Latin America by the U.S. government during World War II.

The series concludes with these two programs: **October 24:** "German, Italian and Japanese Immigrants in the U.S. & the World War II Enemy Alien Program."

**November 14:** "U.S. Rendition of Japanese, Germans & Italians from Latin America During World War II."

Focusing on "The World War II Enemy Alien Program and Lessons for Today," program speakers include:

- Lawrence DiStasi, past president of the American Italian Historical Association/Western Regional Chapter; Project Director of Una Storia Segreta: When Italian Americans Were "Enemy Aliens" exhibit; and author of *Una Storia Segreta: Essays on the World War II Internment and Evacuation of Italian Americans* (2001).
- **John Christgau**, author of numerous books, short stories and articles, including *ENEMIES: WWII Alien Internment*, the first book published about the highly secret World War II alien enemy internment program (1985, 2010); and frequent guest lecturer to professional and educational groups.
- Grace Shimizu, director of the Japanese Peruvian Oral History Project and the Campaign For Justice: Redress NOW for Japanese Latin Americans!, and coordinator of the Enemy Alien Files Consortium.

This first program in the series on September 12 explored how wartime fears, anti-immigrant attitudes and racism affected men, women and children against whom no charges of wrong-doing were ever brought.

Throughout the 1930s, as turmoil in Europe and Asia escalated, the U.S. government prepared for the possibility of U.S. involvement in war. Preparations included surveillance of German, Japanese and Ital-

ian immigrants — both in the U.S. and Latin America, compiling lists of "potentially dangerous persons," alien registration, and planning for internment and deportation.

On the day Pearl Harbor was attacked, FBI and INS agents began arresting aliens, many thousands of whom were interned for up to seven years. The U.S. government also went outside its borders to bring more than 6,000 German, Japanese, and Italian residents of Latin America to internment camps all over the United States. Many of these internees were deported to war-torn countries in hostage exchanges for U.S. citizens trapped abroad.

Many of the actions taken during World War II, including the mass incarceration of 120,000 Japanese Americans (two-thirds of whom were U.S. citizens), were based on presidential Executive Orders, bypassing Congress and the Constitution.

Since the Afghanistan/Iraq War and even before 9/11, Muslims and people of Middle Eastern and South Asian ancestry have struggled against stereotypes based on their national origin or religion. Their civil rights are still at risk as the government attempts to balance legitimate national security concerns with the protection of individual liberties.

This nation has grappled with these issues before. What can we learn from the hidden World War II experiences of "enemy aliens"?

# ROSIE THE RIVETER/WWII HOME FRONT NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK WELCOMES FOURTH-GRADE STUDENTS THROUGH "EVERY KID IN A PARK" INITIATIVE

PROGRAM ENCOURAGES FAMILIES, CLASSES TO VISIT NATIONAL PARKS

he Rosie the Riveter/WWII Home Front National Historical Park invites all fourth-grade students to visit the park as part of the White House's new "Every Kid in a Park" program.

Fourth-grade students can go to www.everykidina-park.gov to complete an activity and obtain a free annual Every Kid in a Park entry pass to more than 2,000 federal recreation areas, including national parks.

The pass may be used from September 1, 2015, through August 31, 2016.

"This is an exciting time as the National Park Service begins its centennial celebration. We're offering a special invitation to fourth-graders and their families to discover everything that national parks offer, including films, walks along the Bay Trail, meeting with real Rosies, and Junior Ranger activities here at Rosie the Riveter/WWII Home Front National Historical Site," said Acting Superintendent Sue Fritzke.

The website also includes fun and engaging learn-



ing activities aligned to educational standards, trip planning tools, safety and packing tips and other important and helpful information for educators and parents.

In addition to providing every fourth-grader in America a free entry pass for national parks and federal public lands and waters, fourth-grade educators, youth group leaders and their students across the country will also participate in the program through field trips and other

learning experiences.

Educators working with fourth-graders who are interested in visiting Rosie the Riveter/World War II National Historical Park should contact (510) 232-5040, ext. 0, to arrange their visit.

The goal of the Every Kid in a Park program is to connect fourth-graders with the great outdoors and inspire them to become future environmental stewards, ready to preserve and protect national parks and other public lands for years to come.
