PINOLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY RECEIVES GIFT FROM THE PINOLE-HERCULES OLD SCHOOL REUNION COMMITTEE

he Pinole Historical Society has received a \$1,000 donation from the Pinole-Hercules Old School Reunion Committee.

The Hercules Historical Society also received a \$1,000 check.

After nine reunions, the committee decided there would be no more.

"We had money left in the bank account and we wanted it to go to preserve the history of the Old School," committee member Shirley Ramos wrote in a letter to the Pinole and Hercules historical societies.

"I suggested donating \$1,000 to each society and the committee agreed unanimously. We know that both historical societies will keep the history of our Old School alive."

The other members of the committee are Alene Wessman, Marge Dean, Beverly Demorest, and Bob and Marilyn Patterson.

"We are very grateful for this generous donation," says Pinole Historical Society president Jeff Rubin.

"I have been to two Old School reunions, and it was amazing to see the number of graduates who attended and the fun they had sharing memories.

"We will put this money to good use as we plan for the establishment of the Pinole History Museum, which definitely will keep the history of the Old School alive."

PHS HAS A NEW NOTE CARD FOR SALE


his spectacular image of the Fernandez Mansion, taken by photographer Earl Combs using his drone, has been turned into a note card for sale at the Pinole Historical Society's farmers' market booth.

Earl graciously and generously donated the photo to the society's collection and is allowing us to sell the cards, with proceeds going to the society.

Bernardo Fernandez, a Portuguese immigrant, built Pinole's most historic and iconic home, one of two structures in the city on the National Register of Historic Places, in 1894.

Fernandez was the area's leading merchant and trader. His decendants, the sixth generation of the Fernandez family, still live in Pinole.

- NOVEMBER 3 PROGRAM -

TRAVELING THE JUAN BAUTISTA DE ANZA NATIONAL HISTORIC TRAIL

he society's final program of the year will feature a representative from the National Park Service presenting a program on the exploration that changed the course of California's history.

The 1,200-mile Juan Bautista de Anza National Historic Trail commemorates the Spanish colonial Anza Expedition of 1775-76 and the first non-Native families to journey overland into California.

Today, the Anza Trail connects historic, cultural, and recreation sites across Arizona and California that reveal a legacy of the West's Hispanic heritage.

The Anza Trail connects Mexico to San Francisco, and the 18th

century to the 21st. It invites travelers to experience the interweaving of the three elements of the Spanish plan for the colonization of its northern frontier: presidios (military forts), missions (religious centers), and pueblos (civilian towns).

By following the trail, it becomes easier to grasp the links between the presidios of Tubac, Santa Barbara, and San Francisco, and to see patterns in the location, construction, and use of Spanish missions.

By visiting sites marking the humble beginnings of the cities of San José (founded in 1777) and Los Angeles (founded in 1781), their modern development becomes even more marvelous.

The National Park Service promotes the preservation of public access to areas related to the Anza expedition so that they can be enjoyed and appreciated. The purpose of the Anza Trail is thus to preserve a significant part of the history of the Southwest and to provide the means for a diverse group of Americans to make connections to the story of the Anza expeditions and the people affected by them.

You can appreciate the experiences of expedition members by driving the Anza Trail from Nogales, Arizona, to San Francisco, or visiting places in between. You can walk, hike, or ride along the recreational trail, or visit nearly a hundred historical sites.

In memoriam

JERRY ROY DEUKER SR.

April 23, 1935 – September 5, 2017

Age 82



erry Deuker, Pinole Valley High School's first varsity football coach, winner of four North Coast Section titles, and Cal-Hi Sports Coach of the Year in 1978, when he led the Spartans to an 11-1 record, died September 5. He was 82.

PVHS principal Kibby Kleiman wrote this moving tribute to coach Deuker: "The name Jerry Deuker is not going to mean a lot to folks who walk this campus today, but he deserves a lot more than just a moment.

"When the school opened in 1967, Coach Deuker was a PE teacher and football coach. Imagine coming to a new school and being told to build a program.

"What a program he built. Pinole Valley football teams made the NCS within years, played against elite schools, and not only held their own, but beat them. We played at the Oakland Coliseum for the title, we played the best of the region, and had undefeated seasons.

"We build our lives on more than wins and losses. I only met the man once, but the stories and his legacy live on every Friday night and every school day, as well.

"Coach Deuker worked as a teacher for 37 years at Pinole Valley. Looking through old yearbooks, you see a man dressing up for Spirit Days and putting his students first. Some of those students became professional athletes and some of them became educators and coaches. Some became scholars and some became artists. All seemed touched by the man who was honored here years ago when the stadium was named for him.

"After retiring [as varsity coach] in 2000, Coach Deuker stayed on as an assistant coach, which shows an amazing lack of ego. He was a teacher, a coach, a leader, and by all accounts, a great man.

"I have been taking phone calls from former students from across the country who all say the same thing: "Coach Deuker changed my life."

"In honor of a fallen Spartan, we salute you coach."



There is a shared pride of camaraderie understood only by those who bore the trials of the daily uphill climb to the creaking stairs and dark halls haunted by the strict stares of lurking teachers.


You'll find our quarterly programs, interviews, Veterans Day programs, George Vincent's two walking tours

NEW PHOTO BOOK ABOUT LAKE TAHOE

LAKE OF THE SKY IMAGES: THE PHOTOGRAPHY OF HAROLD A. PARKER

The Lake of the Sky Images: The Photographs of Harold A. Parker, the first survey of Parker's Lake Tahoe regional photographs, documents the career of a commercial photographer inspired by the Lake of the Sky to capture images treasured still today.

Capturing the pristine beauty of Lake Tahoe and key to its transformation into an international destination is Harold A. Parker (1878–1930). Initially engaged by D.L. Bliss as a commercial photographer, Parker's brochure images promoting the Tahoe Tavern were widely distributed throughout the West. Parker images of accessible sights from the steamship *Tahoe* soon became treasured mementoes of summers spent at Lake Tahoe

by city sophisticates and schoolmarms alike.

Images frequently recognized but often unattributed to Harold A. Parker set the artistic standard for Lake Tahoe photography for decades. Parker held the summer franchise for the Tahoe Tavern photo studio and newsstand from 1908 to 1913. Successor photographers often set their tripod in Parker's footsteps to capture the same image.

Parker studied at Throop Polytechnic Institute better known today as Caltech, Pasadena, in its first class of 1900. Parker soon established himself as an outstanding commercial photographer in the San Gabriel Valley. His adventuresome spirit found him in San Francisco capturing earthquake images, ballooning above the San Gabriel Mountains photographing the first aerial pictures of Pasadena, and summering at the Tahoe Tavern filming panoramic majesty.



On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed the Flag Resolution which stated: "Resolved, that the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Francis Hopkinson, of New Jersey, a naval flag designer and a signer of the Declaration of Independence, designed the 1777 flag.

The original flag has been modified 26 times and was unchanged with its 48 stars for 47 years, beginning with Arizona's and New Mexico's admittance to the Union on July 4, 1912. On January 3, 1959, when Alaska was admitted to the Union, the number of stars increased to 49. On August 21, 1959, when Hawaii was admitted to the Union, the flag showed 50 stars.

Other flag holidays include Inauguration Day (every four years), election days, state and local holidays, Admission Day, and others proclaimed by the President of the United States.


