FORMER CONTRA COSTA TIMES COLUMNIST TOM BARNIDGE WILL BE OUR GUEST SPEAKER



Before retiring in 2016, former Contra Costa Times Metro Columnist Tom Barnidge was a journalist for 46 years.

He was a sportswriter and columnist for the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch*, managing editor of *The Sporting News*, and executive editor of the National Football League's Publishing Division before coming to Walnut Creek in 2004 to become sports editor of the *Contra Costa Times*.

He left sports journalism in 2009 to fill the newspaper's need for a metro columnist. During his seven years in that position, he observed, analyzed and offered opinions about life in the East Bay in a column that appeared in the local news section three times a week.

He wrote about topics as diverse as city council races, telephone scams, the fire district, medical marijuana, BART labor negotiations, Common Core education, the demise of Doctors Medical Center, County Supervisors' salary hikes, high-speed rail, and the effectiveness of government agencies. He says it was a welcome change from interviewing athletes and writing about zone defenses.

Tom lives in Concord with his wife, Faith, who started reading his column when he quit writing about sports.

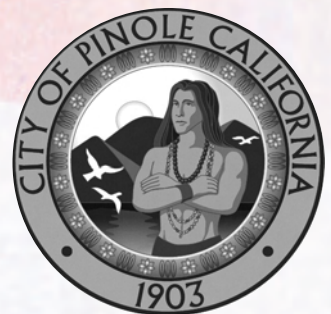

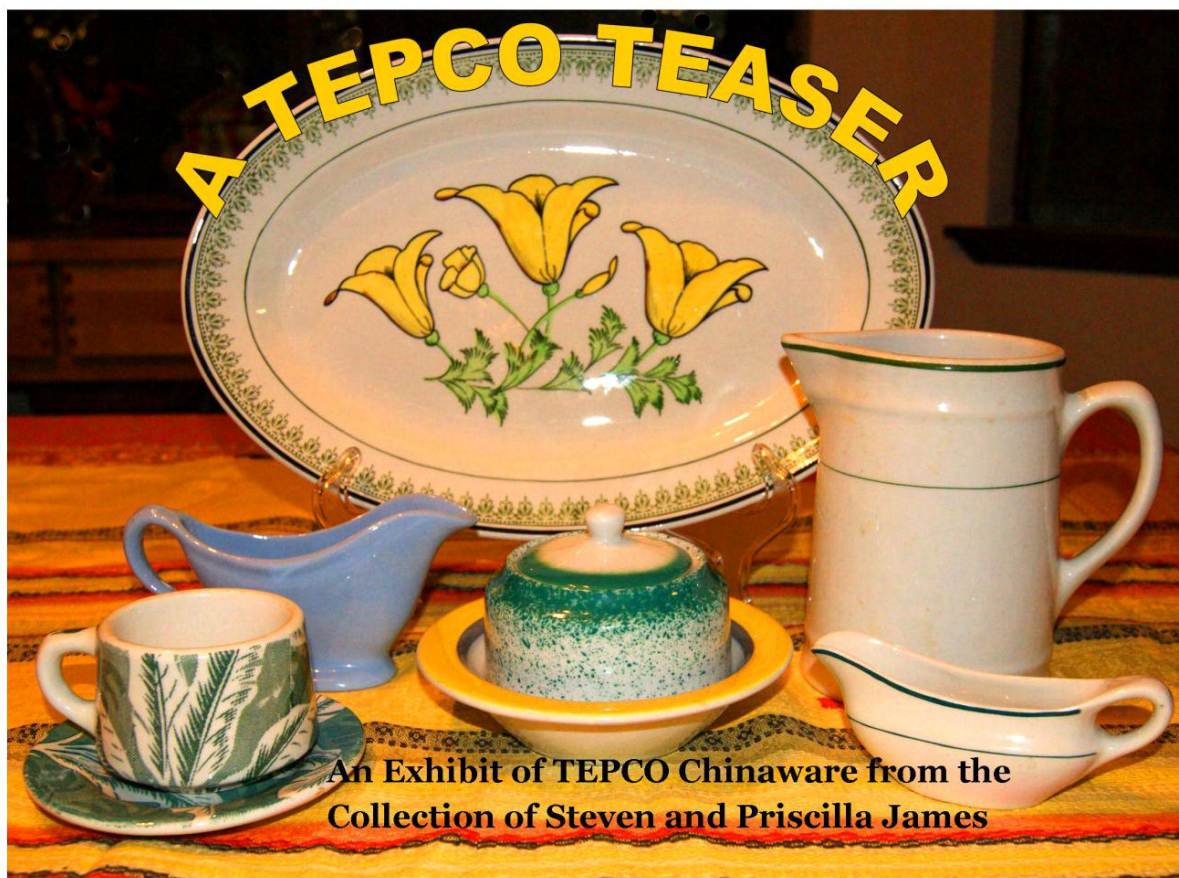


Exhibit Opening: Saturday, September 15, 2018

For 50 years, from 1918 until 1968, the **Technical Porcelain and China Ware Company** (TEPCO) was a major west-coast producer of tableware for restaurants, hotels, churches and lodges, the military, and others. Their output was prodigious, and TEPCO ware is still in commercial use.

Robust and utilitarian, TEPCO ware is also distinctive, and quite lovely in its own way. If you are a TEPCO buff, or just like ceramics, this is a show you don't want to miss.

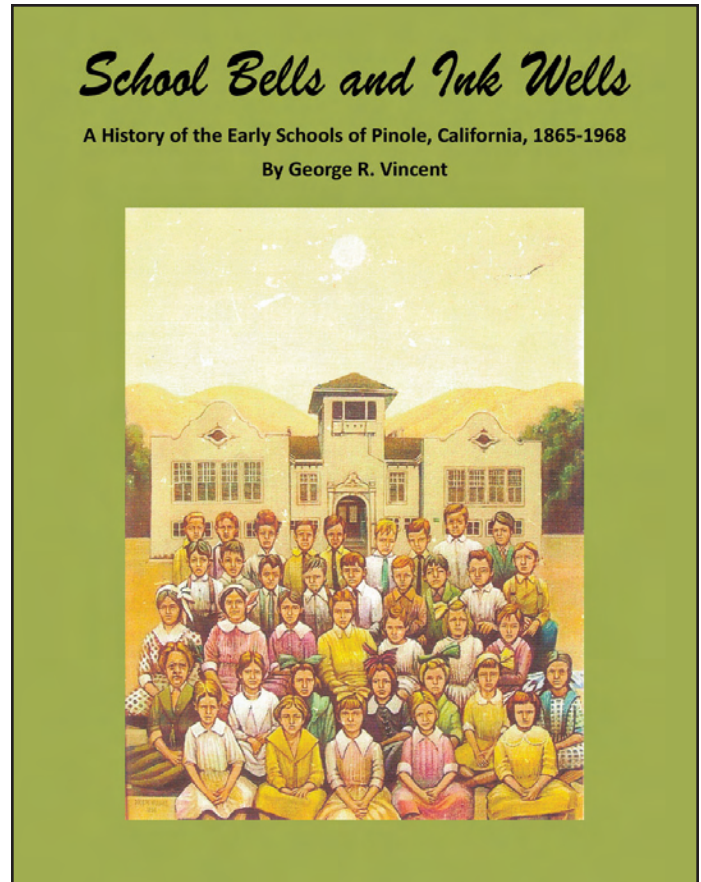
The 124-page book, featuring more than 150 photos, some never-before seen, chronicles the history of the Fitzgerald Ranch School (1865-1886), Plaza School (1886-1906), and Pinole-Hercules School #1 (1906-1966).

The book is filled with stories and amusing anecdotes, and anyone who went to school in Pinole will treasure this fond memory of their early education.

The book brings to light the workings and people that made the Pinole-Hercules Union School District the envy of surrounding townships.

Hill School alumni are fiercely loyal to their "green school" that stood atop Samuel Street in Pinole until 1968. There is a shared pride of camaraderie understood only by those who bore the trials of the daily uphill climb to the creaking stairs and dark halls haunted by the strict stares of lurking teachers.

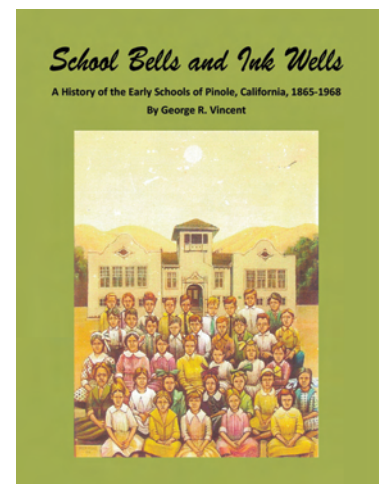

KGO radio reporter Jennifer Jones Lee interviewed PHS President Jeff Rubin to discover the origin of the word "Pinole."

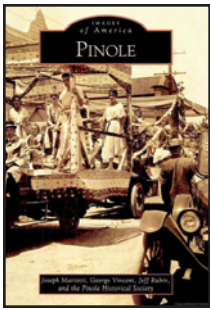

LOCAL HISTORY BOOKS AVAILABLE FROM THE PINOLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

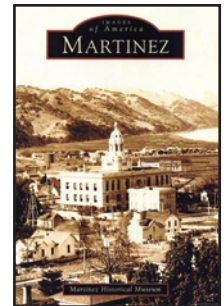

Flag Holidays

Every year we see more American flags being displayed for community and special events.

On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed the Flag Resolution which stated: "Resolved, that the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Francis Hopkinson, of New Jersey, a naval flag designer and a signer of the Declaration of Independence, designed the 1777 flag.

The original flag has been modified 26 times and was unchanged with its 48 stars for 47 years, beginning with Arizona's and New Mexico's admittance to the Union on July 4, 1912. On January 3, 1959, when Alaska was admitted to the Union, the number of stars increased to 49. On August 21, 1959, when Hawaii was admitted to the Union, the flag showed 50 stars.

- National Day of Prayer (First Thursday in May)
- V-E Day (May 8)
- Mother's Day (Second Sunday in May)
- Peace Officers Memorial Day (May 15; half-staff all day)
- Armed Forces Day (Third Saturday in May)
- Memorial Day (Last Monday in May; half-staff until noon)
- D-Day (June 6)
- Flag Day (June 14)
- Father's Day (Third Sunday in June)
- Independence Day (July 4)
- Korean War Veterans Day (July 27)
- V-J Day (September 2)
- Labor Day (First Monday in September)
- Patriot Day (September 11; half staff all day)
- Constitution Day (September 17)
- Gold Star Mothers Day (September 27)
- Columbus Day (Oct. 12)
- Navy Day (October 27)
- Election Day (First Tuesday in November)
- Veterans Day (Nov. 11)
- Thanksgiving Day (Fourth Thursday in November)
- Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day (December 7; half staff all day)
- Christmas Day (Dec. 25)

Other flag holidays include Inauguration Day (every four years), election days, state and local holidays, Admission Day, and others proclaimed by the President of the United States.
