

VIDEOS AND PANEL DISCUSSION ON WORLD WAR II INTERNMENT OF JAPANESE-AMERICAN U.S. CITIZENS

he internment of Japanese-American citizens during World War II will be the subject of a joint program between the Pinole Historical Society and Pinole Library from 6:30 to 8 p.m. this Thursday, September 6, at the Kaiser Permanente Medical Office Building in Pinole.

"Internment Memories: Japanese-Americans remember life during World War II"

will feature a panel of local Japanese-American citizens who were interned, and videos about the three-year incarceration of more than 110,000



citizens in 10 camps throughout the West.

The PHS and Pinole Library thank Barbara Saito, of the Contra Costa chapter of the Japanese American Citizens League and Tom Panas, of the El Cerrito Historical Society, for their help in putting together this program.

This program will be a prelude to a September 29 appearance at the Hercules

Library by Jeanne Wakatsuki Houston, co-author of *Farewell to Manzanar*, the acclaimed book about her life in California's Manzanar internment camp.

Dr. Joe to be honored at November 11 dinner

he Pinole Historical Society is having two events on Sunday, November 11, that are of considerable interest to Pinole residents.

November 11 is Veterans Day. This year the PHS will conduct is 5th Annual Veterans Day Memorial and Flag Retirement Ceremony at 11 a.m. in Fernandez Park.

And, later that afternoon, from 5 to 8 p.m. at the Pinole Senior Center, the society will honor Dr.

Joseph Mariotti, co-founder of the Pinole Historical Society, with a lifetime achievement award. We're calling this event "Joe's Party."

Dr. Joe's civic achievements are numerous. As an orthopaedic surgeon, he was the team physician for Pinole Valley High School for 32 years.

He is a longtime environmentalist and conserva-



tionist who has served on the Save Contra Costa Shoreline Committee, Hercules Environmental Resources Committee, Urban Creek Council, East Bay Regional Parks Advisory Committee, Contra Costa County Plastic Recycling Advisory Committee, Coastal Clean-Up, West Contra Costa Environmental Education Committee, and the Friends of Pinole Creek Watershed.

And, he was a member of the Contra Costa County Historical Landmarks Advisory Committee from 2003-2010 and is a member of the Pinole Garden Club, which honored him with a ceremony on March 22, 2011, by planting a Crape

Myrtle tree in his honor at Bayfront Park.



How about important athletic events, such as a high-school football, basketball, baseball, softball, or volleyball game?

Perhaps you have film of an important event that took place in Fernandez Park, or a ribbon cutting or an event that has a place in Pinole's history — such as the 1958 flood?

We're looking for any video or film you have — VHS, Beta, camcorder, DV tape, 8mm, Super 8mm, 16mm, 35mm, motion picture.

We want to collect, digitize, catalog, and preserve old movies on DVD (and whatever formats are to come) to exhibit, educate, and entertain.


PHS SELLING PINOLE MEMORABILIA AT FARMERS' MARKET

You may purchase one or more of these books from us at the Pinole Farmers' Market—we'll be there every other Saturday through the end of December.


