SCHOOL DAYS IN VERY OLD PINOLE


he alumni of Pinole-Hercules "Old School on the Hill" will gather at the Elks Lodge in El Sobrante on September 12 for their ninth reunion.

To Pinole newcomers, it may seem odd that folks would

want to come together to celebrate a grammar school. Don't tell that to Pinoleans who graduated from Pinole-Hercules School #1 (1906-1968), as did many of their parents and grandparents.

Alumni are fiercely loyal to their green school that stood atop Samuel Street in Pinole until 1968. There is a shared pride of camaraderie understood only by those who bore the trials of the daily uphill climb to the creaking stairs and dark halls haunted by the strict stares of lurking teachers.

On Friday, September 11, from 6:30 to 8 p.m. in rooms 2A and 2B of the





Kaiser Permanente Medical Office Building, the Pinole Historical Society will trace the history of Pinole's three oldest schools — Fitzgerald Ranch School, Pinole Plaza School, and Pinole-Hercules School #1 — from 1865-1968.

Our presenter, Pinole Historical Society co-founder, Old School alumnus, and longtime educator George Vincent, has spent a decade researching Pinole's early schools.

His soon-to-be-published book, "School Bells and Ink Wells," brings to light the workings and people that made the Pinole-Hercules Union School District the envy of surrounding townships.

November 6 program


PHS will present author of new book about the 1915 Panama-Pacific International Exposition

In memoriam

MICHAEL REI April 28, 1934 — July 17, 2015

Michael Rei, a well-known civil engineer, partner in the firm of Kister Savio & Rei, Inc., and lifetime member of the Pinole Historical Society, died on July 17. He was 81.

Mike was a member and past president of the Pinole Jaycees and the Pinole Rotary Club, and was a member of the Exhausted Roosters, PIGS, Pinole Chamber of Commerce, and the Pinole Historical Society.

"Most of the young movers and shakers in Pinole were in the Jaycees," says Pinole City Councilman Roy Swearingen. "Mike, Jack Meehan, and I were three of the original 20+ members that formed the Pinole Jaycees in 1964-65."

Mike served as president of the Jaycees in 1969-70 and during his leadership that year Pinole won the Hy Geisenbier award for the #1 Jaycees organization

in its population division statewide. Mike received the award for outstanding local president also. Mike presided over a 100+ member club.

"Mike also worked with the Richmond Unified School District to resurface the football field and add lights for night games," Swearingen said. "The Spartan sign on the side of the gymnasium and bleachers in the gym were also projects completed under Mike's leadership. Mike continued using his leadership skills by joining newly formed Pinole Rotary club around 1972 as a charter member and served a year as president of that club."

"I first met Mike in the early '60s," said Jack Meehan. "Mike was a trustworthy and loyal friend.

"When I found myself in a true get-it-done position with a reputable development/construction company, my obvious choice for the project's civil engineer was Mike.

"I held him in the highest professional and personal regard. He was a man to be emulated."

EMMY LOU PACKARD: DRAWING NEW CONCLUSIONS IN THE KAISER SHIPYARDS EXHIBIT OPENING AND LECTURE AT THE VISITOR CENTER

n Saturday, September 5, at 11 AM, Lincoln Cushing from Kaiser Permanente Heritage Resources will host an opening for an exhibition about the graphic art of Emmy Lou Packard who was employed by the Kaiser Shipyards during World War II in Richmond.

The World War II Home Front was truly a setting where "ordinary people did extraordinary things." One of the best records of that dynamic period was the weekly Kaiser Richmond shipyard magazine Fore 'n' Aft, with news and stories of a war industry in which new workers were doing new jobs in new ways.


California artist Emmy Lou Packard (1914-1998) was on the Fore 'n' Aft staff and contributed approximately 100 illustrations. Packard's work was patriotic without resorting to racist jabs or stereotypes; she portrayed workers with dignity and character. She drew women's experiences from a woman's point of view – numerous vignettes are of children (one of her regular subjects later in life), home life, and the challenges of survival and adjustment in a tempestuous time.

This exhibition features large reproductions of exemplary graphic art Packard made between 1944 and 1945, filling in a significant void in Home Front history, art history, and even of Packard's own documented career.

The exhibition is curated by Kaiser Permanente historian and archivist Lincoln Cushing, and is sponsored by Kaiser Permanente in partnership with the National Park Service. Some of the images are from the Richmond Museum of History.

The exhibition is displayed in the lower level of the Visitor Center and will be available to the public through January of 2016.
