BLUE SKY SPORTS IS CLOSING, A VICTIM OF THE PANDEMIC

he end of a business era is at hand for muchtreasured Blue Sky Sports, a victim of the pandemic that hastened owner Gregg Fehr's decision to close.

After 40 years, starting in his garage and then to two retail locations before moving to his current building in 1989, Gregg will close by the end of October or early November.

Blue Sky Sports — and Gregg — have touched the lives of many individuals, schools, and groups.

From supplying school teams with uniforms and equipment, to making commemorative plaques, and screen-printing shirts and table covers for the Pinole Garden Club and the Pinole Historical Society, among others, to the famed batting cages, this business and this person have been an important fixture in our community.

Facebook has been full of appreciative comments from friends and customers since Gregg announced the store's closing in August.

Gregg, 66, had planned to sell the business in a couple of years and retire to his vacation home a few miles above Auburn. His brother Chuck's death in March and the pandemic changed his plans.

"I'm not angry; the

pandemic and my brother's death allowed me to put my priorities in place," Gregg says.

"I needed to rethink my life a little bit. It's totally bittersweet.

"I was trying to sell the business and the building together. The pandemic just killed that. Nobody wanted the business and nobody wanted the building.

"I just want to spend time with my grandkids. I just want to enjoy the time I have left. I'm gonna go up into the mountains, where there are tractors to mess around with. It will be a whole different life.

"Sometimes you feel you don't make a difference, but I'm awestruck about the amount of love I've received since I announced the store is closing. It makes me feel good that I've made a difference."

PANDEMIC HAS AFFECTED HISTORICAL SOCIETIES, TOO

veryone has been affected in some way by the Covid-19 pandemic.

Local businesses have closed or been severely curtailed, people are hurting financially, and, tragically, some of our friends locally have lost people close to them to this virulent disease.

In a far less serious way the Pinole Historical Society has also been affected.

- Cancellation of quarterly programs.
- No Pinole History Museum fundraising dinner this fall.
- No Veterans Day Memorial and Flag Retirement Ceremony this year.
- No history programs presented to fourth-grade students, and no history programs for service organizations and senior groups.
- Suspension of the print edition of PHS *Newsbriefs*, our quarterly newsletter.

The pandemic has also provided us, and other historical societies and

museums, with unforeseen opportunities to better communicate with members, supporters, and community.

The Pinole Historical Society:

- Created the Pinole Historical Society YouTube Channel. Thank you to Pinole History Museum board member Alex Jason, who uploaded some 30 recorded history programs.
- Produced three well-received history programs via Zoom, and three online-only editions of Newsbriefs.
- Has been adding metadata to the entire 1,300+ collection of PHS photos that are stored on CatalogIt, a cloud-based Collections Management System. In 2021, our entire online photo archive will be available for viewing by the public.
- Explored virtual museum tour systems offered by several vendors.


The Pinole History

the Pinole History Museum. Negotiations have
been friendly. We will
keep you posted on our
progress.

Pinole History Museum volunteers and independent contractors have been searching for grant opportunities to fund the creation of museum exhibits. Should the Pinole City Council approve the renovation of the Faria House, the museum board will be ready to begin applying for grants.

The museum board is planning the first year of exhibits and programs.

If all goes well, the museum will open in

2023, and we'll be celebrating the 200th anniversary of the 17,786-acre El Pinole Grant to retired Mexican soldier Ygnacio Martinez in 1823 that included the area that became the City of Pinole.

Back in the day

MANUEL MARCOS HOME COMMEMORATES CENTENNIAL YEAR

mong the grandest and mosthistoric homes in Pinole is this beautiful Craftsman at 999 Tennent Avenue, on the northeast corner of Tennent and Prune Street.

It's owned by Mike and Brenda Gooding, who bought it from a woman named Myrtle Smith in 1998. But, its history dates back 100 years, when it was built in 1920 by Manuel Marcos, one of the most prominent businessman in old Pinole.

Prior to the 1930s, the site of Fernandez Park was occupied by the two-story Commercial Hotel, owned and operated by Manuel Marcos, who also ran the saloon where The Bear Claw is today.

The Commercial Hotel catered to boarders and served meals at all hours and competed with the other hotels in the area, such as The Pinole Hotel, which burned down in 1914.

The Commercial Hotel was one of the oldest in Pinole going back to the

turn of the century with different owners. In 1914, it had 40 boarders who paid \$20 a month. The hotel stood close to where home plate is today.

Manuel Marcos was the grandfather of Jackie Marcos Pericoli, of El Sobrante. Manuel and Virginia Marcos had 10 children, nine who lived. Jackie's father, Albino (Beno), was the third child born.

She fondly remembers 999 Tennent Avenue, particularly Sunday family dinners.



of my growing up," says Jackie. "We'd be there every Sunday. It was almost mandatory. All of the families went to grandma's for dinner. All of the women dressed up with hats and gloves; it was de rigueur in those days.

"The men were so interesting. They would go in the kitchen, which was a very little square room with a wooden stove that my grandmother cooked on. At the other was a pantry. In between there was a long table, where there was room for 10 people.

"The men divided, the more liberal on one side and the (conservative) bankers on the other (Manuel Jr.). My dad was a liberal, a union man.

"The men would have lively conversations; there would be some good arguments. My grandmother would sit in her rocker (in the dining room) and say, 'Boys!" Boys!' I wanted to be near the men.

"I loved that house. It meant my family." 999 Tennent also means family to the Goodings, who reared four children there.
