President's Message

Jeff Rubin, President, Pinole Historical Society and Pinole History Museum

Museum denial is self-inclicted wound on the City of Pinole

he value of history is that it teaches us the importance of knowing how and what came before us so we understand why life and circumstances are like they are today.

History can be especially instructive for the many new families and residents of our city, and for young adults in their 20s and 30s who were very young back in the day and are now becoming politically and socially involved in our city. They may not be aware of how events that took place more than a decade ago are shaping the political and social climate in the city today.

History can also help explain why the historic Faria House sits unoccupied and slowly rotting, and why, despite decades of promises by previous city councils, there is no museum in the City of Pinole.

History connects the dots. I'll connect a few historical dots here.

THE PINOLE RECALL

In 2007-08, there was a recall election targeting three candidates on the Pinole City Council; one of them, David Cole, resigned. The others, then-mayor Maria Alegria and Stephen Tilton, a new councilman only 14 months into his first term, were recalled in a special election on February 5, 2008, both with nearly 60% of voters removing them from office.

There's not enough space here to discuss all the reasons for the recall; you can learn about one of the few successful recalls in California's history at www.PinoleRecall.com.

CONCERNED CITIZENS OF PINOLE

The Pinole Recall was sponsored by the Concerned Citizens of Pinole (CCOP), a grass-roots community group advocating for quality-of-life issues in Pinole. CCOP was organized as a General Purpose Committee with the California Secretary of State. I was part of that group. I remained deeply involved until CCOP was dissolved a few years ago.

On February 5, 2008, Ivette Ricco ran in the special election to fill the 21/2 years remaining in Cole's council term; she lost by more than a 2-1 margin to Debbie Long.

Eight months later, in the regular election on November 4, 2008, Ricco ran for treasurer against the incumbent, Judy Lee.

She lost by nearly a 2-1 margin. Alegria also ran in that election, trying to reclaim her council seat. She got less than 20% of the vote and lost.

In 2012, Ricco ran for the council again, this time against incumbents Pete Murray and Roy Swearingen for one of two seats. She finished third. Also in 2012, Alegria ran for the BART Board of Directors, to represent District 7. In a four-person race, she finished third overall; she also finished third in Pinole.

In each of those elections, CCOP opposed Ricco's and Alegria's candidacies.

POLITICAL SHENANIGANS

In recent years, Ricco founded Pinole 4 Fair Government (P4FG), registered with the California Secretary of State as a political organization. Among Ricco's P4FG supporters and confidants are recalled former Mayor Maria Alegria and recalled former Councilman Stephen Tilton. Much of the opposition to Continued on page 4

the museum comes from P4FG and its acolytes.

It's no wonder then, that because of my involvement in CCOP, and now as president of the Pinole Historical Society and the Pinole History Museum, Ricco and her P4FG followers oppose the Faria House renovation and its use as a museum.

(Ricco sent the Pinole History Museum a \$50 donation in July 2020

with a note in the memo line that read, "I support the museum." Then, she continued making public comments against the museum project during city council meetings. The Pinole History Museum board returned her money.)

It's no stretch to surmise that opponents of the museum — most of whom have written or spoken in public or posted comments on social media and were also opposed to the Alegria/Tilton recall — are engaging in retribution stemming from the recall.

It's also no coincidence that P4FG endorsed and supported the three council members who voted against the Faria House renovation in June 2021 — Anthony Tave, Vincent Salimi, and Devin Murphy. It seems Ricco and Alegria, though un-elected, want to control politics in Pinole by controlling the members of the council through P4FG's support.

DOWN MEMORY LANE

For nearly two decades the city has declared its intent to create a museum in the Faria House. This was documented in a report presented to the council in June 2021 by City Attorney Eric Casher.

The council raised expectations in the community that this was going to happen. The museum board has raised tens of thousands of dollars because previous councils — several times — led the community to believe this project was going to be a partnership

between the city and the museum board.

There were 240 people at the last Pinole History Museum fundraising dinner in 2019. Even without a facility, the museum still has more than 200 donors.

Pinole community members have clearly showed their support for a museum.

In 2019-20, the city paid Interactive Resources, an architectural firm, approximately \$100,000 for renovation

plans and a cost estimate for the Faria House project **specifically** for its use as a museum. The city's intent was clear.

THREE RENOVATION/MUSEUM VOTES

The councl has considered a resolution to renovate the Faria House three times, once in November 2020, and twice in June 2021.

On June 15, 2021, during the first of two sessions to finalize the 2021-22 budget, 70 people wrote to the council supporting a museum in the Faria House, and the council included the renovation in the 2021-22 budget. Mayor Norma Martínez-Rubin and Councilmembers Vincent Salimi and Maureen Toms voted YES. Tave and Murphy noted NO.

On June 29, when the council met to approve the budget, Salimi rescinded his vote, citing an unspecified "common law" conflict of interest. He still has not disclosed what the conflict was.

The resolution to renovate the Faria House failed. Seventy public comments in favor of renovation, AND STILL THE COUNCIL VOTED AGAINST IT.

Whose interests are Tave, Murphy, and Salimi representing?

THE FIRST VOTE

In the summer and fall of 2020, Councilman Tave headed a council ad hoc committee established to Continued on page 5

learn about the museum board's fundraising and exhibit plans — and negotiate a lease between the city and the museum board.

The committee consisted of Councilmen Tave and Pete Murray, City Manager Andrew Murray, Assistant City Manager Hector De La Rosa, and City Attorney Eric Casher. The committee negotiated with Pinole History Museum board members Jeff Rubin, Belinda Espinosa, and Diane Dyer.

All of the committee's questions were answered, the museum board provided the committee every document it asked for, and City Attorney Casher prepared a lease agreement for the museum board to approve.

Then Tave killed the deal by voting against an agreement he helped create. Tave negotiated in bad faith on behalf of the city.

How the deal came to be killed by one person is another matter.

NEGOTIATIONS

It was clear during the negotiations that Tave was against this project. He would not budge from his belief that the museum would not be able to sustain itself financially.

Despite providing the ad hoc committee members with the museum board's fundraising plans and income and expense projections comparable to other museums' financial reports — museums in Contra Costa County and those of a similar size in other areas of the state

Tave was not satisfied.
 The city owns the Faria
 House and has to renovate it to the current
 state building code to
 use it for any purpose.

There are eight rooms in the Faria House; if the museum failed after a certain number of years and was forced to abandon the Faria House, the city would have a eight-room building with modern amenities suitable for occupancy by multiple businesses.

MORE STUNTS

On October 26, 2020, just a few weeks before the resolution to approve a memorandum of understanding (MOU) to renovate the Faria House and a lease with the Pinole History Museum came up for a vote on November 17, two P4FG supporters attorney David Ruport and Franke Martinez, now a Pinole Planning Commissioner — formally challenged the eligibility of Councilmembers Norma Martínez-Rubin and Vincent Salimi to vote on the resolution, claiming each had a conflict of interest.

Norma Martínez-Rubin is my wife.

Both challenges were filed on October 26. A

coincidence? I think not.

Recalled former mayor Alegria also made a public comment on November 17, the night of the vote, claiming Martínez-Rubin and Salimi had conflicts of interest.

At the time, both Martínez-Rubin and Salimi were likely YES votes and would have joined Swearingen and Murray in a 4-1 majority to approve the resolution.

It can take several months for the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC), the state agency that regulates campaign financing, conflicts of interest, lobbying, and governmental ethics, to investigate and rule on conflict-of-interest challenges.

It appears Ruport and Franke Martinez strategically waited until the last minute before the council was to vote to file their challenges.

No Conflict

On the advice of City Attorney Casher, Councilmembers Martínez-Rubin and Salimi recused themselves from voting until the FPPC could rule, leaving only then-Mayor Swearingen, Murray, and Tave to vote.

To pass, the museum resolution needed three YES votes. Swearingen and Murray voted YES, and Tave voted NO. The resolution failed.

(Murphy and Councilmember Maureen Toms replaced Swearingen and Murray on the

council in December 2020; Swearingen and Murray were termed out, Murphy and Toms ran unopposed. Toms has long supported the establishment of the Pinole History Museum in the Faria House.)

In the first quarter of 2021, the FPPC issued Continued on page 7

its ruling — neither Councilmember Martínez-Rubin nor Councilmember Salimi has a conflict of interest and are permitted to vote on using the Faria House as a museum. Both could have voted YES in November 2020, and the Faria House renovation would likely be under way right now.

NAME CHANGE

Two P4FG supporters

— David Ruport and
Franke Martinez —
eliminated the YES votes
needed to pass the
resolution to renovate
the Faria House.

If this is P4FG's idea of "fair" government, a more fitting name for this organization would be "Pinole for **OUR** government," as it appears that's what their goal really is.

Are P4FG and its representatives on the council acting in the public's best interests, or is this merely payback for their past grievances?

FALSE NARRATIVE

The city owns the Faria House. The city has the funds to do this project, It's the city's responsibility to renovate it so it can be used. The architect's estimate is approximately \$1.2 million. That cost will likely rise every year.

The Faria House is a liability that's deteriorating more every year. Council approval to fund its renovation will transform it into an asset.

P4FG and its followers have created and spread

a narraive that this project is a million-dollar gift to the Pinole History Museum. THIS IS NOT TRUE.

The Pinole History Museum board has not asked the city for funds to build out the interior of the Faria House and create the exhibits.

The museum board will raise the money; if we don't, the city will have a usable building

to rent for office space or any use it desires.

PRIDE IN OUR CITY

I believe Pinole deserves a museum. It's clear that many people believe this, too.

This city's fascinating history is worth preserving for its residents.

We are a city that's dramatically changing, as evidenced by the diversity of its population.

There's new history being created, history that needs and deserves to be celebrated, chronicled, and preserved.

I know of no community that does not benefit by having a museum. A museum in the Faria House would be a source of civic pride and encourage downtown development. Now it's just a political issue.

And, that's disgraceful.


More videos uploaded to PHS YouTube Channel
