

In memoriam

ALFRED ANTHONY RAMOS December 10, 1932 - March 29, 2017 Age 84

Al was a Pinole boy through and through who loved his lifetime hometown.

The youngest child of Manuel and Olinda Ramos, Al was born into a Portuguese family who had immigrated to Pinole from Madera. He was raised on a ranch in the Pinole Valley with three sisters and two brothers. The ranch is where the new Pinole Valley High School is being constructed.

Al was no stranger to hard work. As a young man, he worked on the Hercules Powder Company's "Bull Gang," and spent summers on the dangerous job of handling horses on the hay presses and bailers in the Pinole Valley.

Al graduated from Pinole's old Hill School and from Richmond High School. It was at a high-school bus stop where he met his lifetime love, Shirley Campbell, at age 16. Shirley was a Pinole girl. They were married in 1954 at Pinole's new St. Joseph's Church and

would have celebrated their 63d anniversary in August.

Al worked as a machinist and tool and dye maker before spending 25 years in the Alameda Fire Department.

He loved the outdoors and was an avid hunter and fisherman. He was a catcher for the Pinole American Legion and

Tri-City League baseball teams that played at Fernandez Park. He belonged to the Pinole Sportsmen's Club and the Portuguese I.D.E.S. Society.

Al is fondly remembered by longtime Pinoleans for his welcoming smile and hugs, his millions of jokes and stories, and his talent for fixing things for friends.

His family was the most important part of Al's life, and he was devoted to them. He is survived by his wife Shirley, four children (Ross, Greg, Patti, and Brian), and six grandchildren. Al will be deeply missed on the streets and bayfront of Pinole.







Fond Memories

Can you live without your iPhone?

he classic example of early communication was the children's toy that consisted of two tin cans or paper cups, strung together with a tautly held string.

Credit for the invention of the electric telephone was fiercely battled, but Alexander Graham Bell was successful in getting the first patent. In 1915, he made the first transcontinental call from New York City to his former associate, T. A. Watson in San Francisco.

Since that time, the telephone has evolved into an almost unbelievable hand-held electronic wonder.

My family could not

afford a telephone in our home until about 1935.

At that time, our telephone was mounted on a wall in the corner of the kitchen. It was a brown wooden box with a speaker and two brass bells on the front, a hand crank on the right side, and an earpiece attached to a cord that was placed in a bracket when you "hung up."

Service in Pinole was through a switchboard in a little room at the back of Louis Ruff's grocery store on the corner of Fernandez and San Pablo avenues. We had one of the more common party lines, and I still remember our number was 143W. It was not unusual for someone to rudely listen in on, or interrupt, your conversation.

All calls out of the city were considered long distance, which we rarely made. My high school friend, Dorethi, lived in Richmond, and had extended service, so she always called me. We discussed homework, boyfriends, and social plans endlessly on the telephone.

Pacific Telephone and Telegraph became AT&T, and San Francisco's first automated dial system opened on March 23, 1929. The old wooden box became obsolete when the automated dial system came to our area.

In the late 1950s, I

worked in a law office as a records-clerk/receptionist and operated a small switchboard at my front desk. With four attorneys and four secretaries, I had my hands full at times, which made me appreciate those operators who handled that large switchboard in the back of Ruff's grocery store.

From the rotary dial phone of the 60s to the cellular revolution of the 80s to Apple's introduc-



Continued from page 6 tion of the iPhone in 2007, followed by Google's Android in 2008, we are now living in a world of smartphones. The following are just some of the things that your iPhone can do for you: take photos, play music, send and receive e mails, send texts, shoot videos, navigate GPS, do math calculations, browse the Web, etc.

Back in the day

HISTORY IS WHERE YOU FIND IT

n the mid 1960s, a beach walker spotted some old books in the landfill at the Pinole waterfront. He pulled out three large ledgers from a pile of decaying documents. His curiosity saved some of Pinole's early history of vital records.

The books that he salvaged were city tax ledgers from 1910-1911 and 1925-1930. Apparently, some city official had disposed of a treasure-trove of Pinole's history while cleaning house, thinking that the books were just trash from the past.

This event took place at a time when Pinole was not yet awakening to the necessity of preserving its disappearing heritage.

A few years later, I witnessed a similar destruction of Pinole memorabilia when the Hughes family home at the intersection of Pinole Valley Road and Henry Avenue was slated to be burned for fire-training purposes.

The Hugheses were early downtown residents. Two of Marie Hughes's sons were wellknown Pinoleans.

As a child, Clifford was best man at a school mock wedding. His brother, Gordon, was killed in combat in World War II.


My cousin was on the Pinole Fire Department, and he let me go quickly inside the Hughes home to look around. Room after room was covered in photos, letters, town newspapers, and debris of all sorts.

A whole family's history went up in smoke that day, and some of Pinole's past with it.

This was a time when few saw historical value in old things that stood in the way of progress.

What can be learned about Pinole's history from such artifacts as the books that were saved from bay waters?

The books are an economic history of the town's early dwellers shortly after incorporation and through the Great Depression.

Each Pinole family is enumerated with a description of exactly where they lived.

The lots and block numbers of residents are given with a dollar value of their real estate and improvements and tax assessments.

Of great interest are the names of the sections of Pinole where residents settled: El Rancho Pinole (valley area). Villa Sites, Fernandez

Addition, Cousins Addition, Nob Hill Subdivision, Town of Pinole, and Brandt Subdivision.


For example, John Collins in 1910 owned Lot 1 in Block J in the Fernandez Addition. His improvements were \$1,500. This would be the Klondike Saloon on Tennent Avenue. Collins died in 1909, but the family still lived above the business.

Another businessman, James Silvas, is listed in the Town of Pinole, Lot 1 in Block 3 with \$1,500 in improvements — The Golden West Hotel on the southwest corner of Tennent and San Pablo avenues.

In 1910, we learned how much the movers and shakers of early old town had as personal wealth.

Bernardo Fernandez had \$10,500 in improvements, Edward M. Downer (Bank of Pinole) had \$7,000 in improvements in the Cousins Addition, and Abraham Greenfield (Pinole Department

Continued from page 9 Store) had \$2,435 in personal property wealth, excluding money.

On a personal level, I learned of the probable dates of the building of my family's homes, where they were located, and which members were living at that time.

For instance, my uncle, John Vincent, was still using the last name of Azevedo, before it was later dropped. And my grandfather, Charles Vincent, was still using the Portuguese first name of Seraphin before it was also later dropped for the English word Charles.

John Vincent in 1910 was living in the Fernandez Addition (by today's Fernandez Park. He had a saloon worth \$600 in improvements in Block I, and a barn worth \$100 — The First and Last Chance Saloon. I found that later in 1925 he had \$1,500 in improvements on the same property. This was the family home in which I grew up. He built it in 1924 after the saloon burned down.

On my mother's Irish side, I found that her uncle, Michael J. Scanlan, was still living in downtown Pinole in 1910 in a home worth \$450 on Willow Street. He had been the town constable in the 1890s to 1900.

Of interest also is another Portuguese downtown businessman — Manuel R. Marcos and wife, Fugenia C. Marcos. They had nine children — eight boys and a girl.

Their property in the Fernandez Addition, Lot 15 in Block E, had \$725 in improvements. This is in 1929, where Fernandez Park is today. We learn that his improvement was the Commercial Hotel, which was still in operation during the Great Depression.

Anyone doing genealogy will find these ledgers valuable. History is indeed where you find it, and sometimes it's in the oddest of places or circumstances.

I'm hopeful the day will soon come when these books will be found in Pinole's new museum for the public to enjoy.

PINOLE THEN AND NOW

he 1910 photo on the left was taken facing west on San Pablo Avenue, just east of the entrance to the Santa Fe train depot. San Pablo Avenue was narrow then, one lane in each direction for horse carts and the occasional automobile.

The home with the steeple-like cupola, built in

1895, belonged to William W. Mann and his wife, Elizabeth. Mann was a foreman at the California Powder Works.

The now-developed hills in the background were unspoiled, save for a reservoir that diverted water from Pinole Creek to serve the needs of Pinole and Hercules residents and the powder works.
