

In memoríam

Pete Norgaard October 9, 1946 – February 3, 2020 Age 73

n February 3, Pete Norgaard passed away. He was 73.

He was the only child of Henry (Hank) and Pat Norgaard.

While not a Pinole native (Rodeo), make no mistake, Pete was a Pinolean through and through.

Moving here at an early age, he attended Pinole-Hercules School #2 (Margaret Collins Elementary) and The Old School (Pinole-Hercules School #1). He would have attended high school here had there been one.

After graduating from Cal State Hayward, Pete taught history and physical education, and coached boys' basketball, at Pinole Valley High School. Pete's boys' basketball team won the North Coast Section championship in 1980.

But that is not where he made his mark.

Throughout my era (late 1950s until now), there were a great many athletes who made their reputation on the playground of Fernandez Park, such as (not in any particular order) Kenny Burrow, Bruce Hall, Frank and Joe Coppa, and Louis Millhollin — and Pete went head-to-head with all of them.

But alas, Peter J. was not to be found in that

rarified air. He was relegated several tiers below them. He was excruciatingly slow, had a vertical leap in the negative numbers, and was as close to being an automatic out at the plate as a baseball player could be.

But, he was in this for the long haul. He showed up and played at Fernandez Park every day of his pre-teen, adolescent, and young-adult life.


When I say every day, it is no exaggeration. On the hottest summer days, we played baseball (games, work-up, three flies up, strike-out, screen ball, et. al) from about 8 a.m. until dinnertime at 5 p.m.

During the rainy season, we played football (tackle — no pads) in the outfield, taking only an hour break for lunch.

In between those seasons, we would adjourn to the park's one asphalt basketball court.

During the times when school was in session, we would hustle down to the park as soon as school let out at 3:15.

In all of the times, despite Pete's lack of athletic prowess, I don't ever remember him being selected anywhere but among the first few picks. (In the interest of full disclosure, Pete was usually a captain and doing the picking.) This was because he was a

man who knew his limitations.

In football, since he had a severe lack of mobility and a disdain for physical contact, but possessed an above-average arm and a very high mental acuity, he was always the quarterback.

In basketball, limited by his lack of verticality, he was nonetheless a prolific shooter. (If you looked up the definition of a "gunner" in the dictionary, you would see a picture of Pete.)

In baseball, he was an underrated pitcher who could tame the mediocre and average hitters. Against the very talented hitters, Pete would never give in to them, preferring to walk them instead.

It was all part of his master plan, as he had developed a masterful pick-off move which eliminated all but the stealthiest of base runners.

The crux of this is that you always wanted to be on the same team as Pete because he, by guile and intelligence, was always going to put you in a position to win, and that ensured you bragging rights until the next day.

During his collegiate years, he worked for the Pinole Recreation Department as a playground director at Ellerhorst Elementary School. During his tenure, he developed many fine athletes and shaped a goodly number of young men into solid citizens. Many of these young men have grown up to be pillars of our community, and many of them lavish credit upon Pete.

Pete's athletic career did not end as an adult. He continued to play year-round sports in all three sports on teams sponsored by many of our local merchants.

He played softball for both the Wagon Wheel and the Mexican Villa, competing in several state and regional championships. He quarterbacked a very talented Mexican Villa touch football team to a trio of

Continued from page 6 county championships. And, he was a prolific scorer as a basketball player for C&C Deli and The Villa in the Pinole Recreation Leagues.

He would have been a scratch golfer if it had not been for an abundance of trees, sand traps, and water hazards, and if the holes had been quite a bit larger.

During the last few years, he had taken charge of running the annual Jerry Deuker Memorial Golf Tournament, which raises

money for scholarships for high school students wanting to attend college.

I don't want to portray Pete's life as one of all fun and games. It was as a history teacher where his light shone the brightest. He made learning history interesting (and I dare say, even fun) for these students, who otherwise would not have been on a path toward graduation.

Pete made myriad friends in all walks of life and touched countless others in a positive manner. His time here was shorter than it should have been, but it was a life well lived.

He leaves behind his wife, Debbie; daughters Anjee, Stacy, and Danielle; a son, Nick; two grandchildren; a granddog, Hurley; his first wife, Patti (Lopes) Clark, and his two sidekicks. Dennis Palmer and John Powderly, who learned to give back with gusto as much wit and sarcasm as they received from Pete.

I feel honored to have counted him as a friend and am so grateful to have played alongside and sometimes opposite him.

EL SOBRANTE HISTORY CENTER TO OPEN IN JUNE

hen the El Sobrante Library caught fire more than two years ago and caused the library's closure, our community was scrambling to carry on its business; the library has been our heart for more than 50 years.

Fortunately, other organizations, particularly the Elks Club, stepped up to provide meeting space in the interim. The fire. however, provided an opportunity to mount a badly needed upgrade.

The library is now a better place, roomier, airy, full of light, and updated in ways that could not have been foreseen in 1975, when it was first brought up-todate. So, we got a better

library and something more — a history center.

Along with the library reconstruction, Supervisor John Gioia saw the opportunity to refurbish the little house behind the library and make it more usable for community groups.

While he was able to find some money for this secondary job, it was made simpler by the fact the services of the general contractor already on site could be utilized without any break in the flow of work, resulting in savings in time and cost.

The old "Friends of the Library" building was thoroughly gutted; new wiring, walls, bathroom, and a heating and A/C system were installed; and the building was

made ADA accessible.

It's now the "Nancy Fahden House," in honor of the first woman supervisor in Contra Costa County (and first female president of the Board of Supervisors), who used this building as one of her offices during her 16-year tenure.

Now the house is an historic building, and a perfect place to house the collection of the El Sobrante Historical Society (ESHS).

The ESHS shares the building with the Friends of the Library. We have roughly one-third of the total space, 21/2 rooms at the right end of the building, around 250 square feet.

We have had access to the building since late November, and have been busily creating exhibits to best display our collection.

Many donors have offered their historic items to us. For instance, Richard Oliver, owner of Oliver's Hardware, donated a very large 1909 map of the Rancho El rare document took weeks to prepare for display; it hangs proudly in our hallway.

We also have received adobe bricks (from the Victor Castro Adobe in El Cerrito) and from both the El Cerrito and San Pablo historical societies. From the Contra Costa County Historical Society we received (on a long-term loan) a matrimonial trunk of Spanish-Mexican origin that once belonged to the John Marsh family.

None of these artifacts would have come to us without space to display them. And, we now have space to display objects we have had for years, but have been unable to show the public.

At the top of that list is our collection of Native American stone implements found along the banks of San Pablo Creek.

Just off the hallway leading from the entrance is the Maurice Abraham Room (named in memory of our late president and founding member). Here we have our document collection and a visitor-accessible computer for searches of our database.

We also have a large collection of items from the old De Anza High School, including very old and beautifully drawn scientific charts, which were old even when the school opened in 1955.

We had hoped to be open by early April, but the current coronavirus pandemic has caused us to push the opening date to Saturday, June 6. As the date nears, we will send out a reminder to our members and to our sister historical societies in the area.

The April 26 Pear Street Bistro fundraiser for the Pinole History Museum has been postponed. A new date will be announced.
