- September 6 PHS program at Kaiser -The history of 610 Quinan Street

The history of one of Pinole's oldest and most historic homes will be the subject of our September 6 program, brought to life by the granddaughter of the paterfamilia of the Lopes family.

Linda Lopes Rosedahl, granddaughter of Antone Lopes Sr., will present a colorful history not only of her grandfather's house, in which she lives, but of three generations of her family in Pinole, dating back to the turn of the 20th century.

The history of the home touches two of Pinole's founding families — the Fernandez and Downer families as Antone Sr. had relationships with both.

All PHS members, their guests, and the public are invited to this FREE event from 6:30 to 8 p.m. in conference rooms 2A and 2B of the Kaiser Permanently Medical Office Building, 1301 Pinole Valley Road.

"The house was built in 1890 by Bernardo Fernandez," Linda says. "I think he built it for his family to live in while the Fernandez Mansion at the end of

How the property came into the Lopes's possession is a slice of Pinole history in itself, one that Linda will embellish with stories about the people who lived there before her grandfather bought it, and the lot next to it, in 1943.

Antone Sr. gave the empty lot to his son, Antone Jr. and his bride, Marian, as a wedding gift. Tony built a house on that lot at 612 Quinan Street. It's the house in which Linda and her sister, Patti Clark, grew up, and in which Patti now lives.

President's Message

Jeff Rubin, President, Pinole Historical Society PHS PRESENTS AWARD AND SCHOLARSHIP

e are very grateful to live in a community where people and organizations support each other. It's one of the most endearing characteristics of small towns and cities.

On July 2, longtime Pinole resident Earl Combs was honored by the City of Pinole and the Pinole Historical Society at the Pinole City Council meeting for making significant contributions to the history of the community.

Mayor Peter Murray presented Earl with a proclamation recognizing his more than 50 years of contributions to the city, including his work as a contractor on the construction of the original Pinole Valley High School and numerous single-family homes that helped populate Pinole Valley in the 1960s.

The Pinole Historical Society presented Earl with its "Friend of History" award in appreciation of his photographic con-

tributions to the society's archives.

Earl's photos of historic buildings, inportant community events, and construction projects, many taken with his drone, document an important period in the city's history — the construction of the new Pinole Valley High School, the Bay Trail Extension over the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks, the Gateway East and West centers, and the modernization of the Pinole-Hercules Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Earl's aerial photos of the Fernandez Mansion, Faria House (future home of the Pinole History Museum), Square Deal Garage, and other historic sites built in the early years of the city's history are a permanent record that will be viewed, studied, and enjoyed by future genera-

tions of our residents.

Speaking of community support, the Pinole History Museum has received widespread support from donors, for which we are very grateful and encouraged.

I've listed all of the museum donors to date on page 4. I hope I've included everyone. Please let me know if I haven't.

We don't know yet how much the renovation of the Faria House will cost. The report from the city's architect is due in October.

REMEMBERING THE LIFE AND POETRY OF RAMONA MARTINEZ

Author's Note: Most of this article came from my book, "Yesterday's Child."

Ramona and my mother, Emily Scanlan, shared their youth on nearby ranches in the Pinole Valley of the early 1900s. They were chums until Ramona's untimely death in 1918.


Her mother gave my mother Ramona's scrapbook and papers, which inspired me to write "Yesterday's Child," I'm hopeful Ramona's memories will find a resting place in our future Pinole History Museum, preserved for those who love history.

hen Don Ygnacio Martinez, patriarch of El Rancho Pinole. died in 1848, he left behind 18,000 acres of choice Contra Costa land. When his namesake grandson, Ygnacio N. Martinez, died 80 years later, his legacy was only that of a few barbering tools.

As befell Spanishspeaking Californios in general, the fortunes of the Martinez family began to turn soon after American occupancy of California and the Gold Rush.

The family found itself in the ironic position of having a fast-growing

Yankee township named in its behalf in 1849 (now the city of Martinez), while the family's own land holdings and culture shrank.





YESTERDAY'S CHILD



REMEMBERING THE LIFE OF RAMONA MARTINEZ

It was in the town of Martinez that Ramona Martinez was born to parents Emma and Ygnacio N. Martinez on April 26, 1900.

This child of the fourth deneration would drow up in a new century facing the hardships of life brought on by impoverished circumstances.

Ramona was characterized by a diverse cultural blending of the fairness of her English mother and her father's hispanic side. She had blue eyes, an olive complexion, and long, dark hair.

Ironically, she also would be the last of the Martinez clan to occupy the old Pinole adobe of her great-grandfather.

Sometime in 1907, her father left Martinez and moved the family into the Pinole Valley and the decaying adobe home of his birthplace.

The old building now belonged to wealthy Pinole landowner Bernardo Fernandez. The landmark home had been badly damaged by the 1906 earthquake. Fernandez allowed the family to live there as caretakers.

Ramona's family at the time was the poorest of the valley's residents. Ramona attended the new downtown Pinole-Hercules School, and her father barbered in town and sold beans and empanadas (meat pies) in the many town saloons.

Ramona's parents passed down to her the glory days of the old adobe and the folklore of better times of great wealth, solid silver table settings, and grand fiestas. But the reality was they were living in one room divided by blankets and surrounded by fallen timbers and adobe bricks.

In 1913, Ramona's parents separated, and for the first time teen-age Ramona and her mother were on their own.

In 1918, Emma took Ramona into the new city of Richmond, where Emma found work renting out rooms and boarding children.

Most of Ramona's poetry was written during her teen years. This was a troubled time for her because of her folks' marital upsets and the onset of Ramona's failing health, thought to be consumption (tuberculosis).

She projected her private emotions as well as her outlook on life into *Continued on page 11*
