CITY COUNCIL PAYS TRIBUTE TO POPULAR SWIMMING TEACHER

he Pinole City
Council recognized the contributions of one
of its most well-known
citizens on November 17
when it issued a proclamation honoring the life
of longtime swimming
coach Ora Webber, who
died last spring at the
age of 100.

Born Dec. 6, 1919, Ora was the longtime owner of the Greenbrae Swimming School, in the backyard of her Tennent Avenue home. Beginning in 1963, she taught several generations of Pinole residents — from toddlers to firefighters.

"Ora Webber was a Pinole icon," said Pinole Mayor Norma Martínez-Rubin. "She probably taught every child in Pinole how to swim. She lived a long, remarkable life. The city is proud to honor her life and present this proclamation to her family.

"May we all live such a meaningful life, and be such a positive influence on the public."

"I, plus three of my four siblings, learned how to swim at Greenbrae Pool," said Councilmember Maureen Toms. "She taught a whole generation of Pinole youth how to swim. Hers was the go-to place. She was a unique and wonderful citizen."

WHEREAS, Ora Anneva Moneymaker Webber was born on December 6, 1919, on the Nez Perce Indian Reservation at Genesee, Idaho, one of 13 children of Elizabeth Mertens Moneymaker and Ora Alexander Moneymaker; and

WHEREAS, Ora's maternal grandfather, Christian Mertens, didn't want to be conscripted into Kaiser Wilhelm's German army during World War I and immigrated with family members to the United States and settled in St. Louis, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, Ora's parents met near Mansfield, Washington, where their families had settled on free land offered by the United States government to any and all qualified citizens who would homestead the land; and


WHEREAS, Ora Webber and her husband lived in Pinole on Tennent Avenue, where Ora opened the Greenbrae Swimming School in 1963; and

WHEREAS, Ora Webber taught several generations of Pinole residents, from small children to adults, how to swim and to be confident in and out of the water; and

WHEREAS, Ora Webber earned the respect, admiration, and love of her students; and

WHEREAS, Ora Webber died in the spring of 2020 at the age of 100, and was one of our oldest-known residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, NORMA MARTINEZ-RUBIN, Mayor of the City of Pinole, County of Contra Costa, State of California, on behalf of the City of Pinole, extend this city's most heartfelt recognition of the life of ORA WEBBER, and the contributions she made to the people of the City of Pinole, and encourage all residents to applaud her achievements, and extend to her family and friends the City's thanks for a life well lived.

President's Message

Jeff Rubin, President, Pinole Historical Society

New year brings optimism for museum creation

e know 2020 was an incredibly difficult year. The Pinole History Museum board of directors hopes you are doing well, are safe, and are optimistic that 2021 will be a better year.

While we were disappointed the Pinole City Council did not approve the renovation of the historic Faria House and a lease to the Pinole History Museum in November 2020, this will be considered again by the council in 2021. We are hopeful the renovation and lease will be approved so work to establish the Pinole History Museum in the Faria House can begin.

We are proceeding on a timeline that we hope will see the museum open sometime in 2023 — in time to celebrate "Birth of a City" — our first planned major exhibit and year-long series of programs commemorating the 200th anniversary of the land grant that created the City of Pinole.

Pinole was carved from the 17,786-acre El Pinole Grant awarded to Don Ygnacio Martinez, a soldier in the Mexican army, in 1823 (map at below right). He chose to build his home, which he named Rancho El Pinole, in the area that is now occupied by Pinole Valley Park.

We are planning a diverse selection of exhibits and programs that will serve all ages and cultures, as reflected in the demographics of our city.

The museum's spacious backyard is planned to be utilized as an events location for community, corporate, and private events that will contribute to civic pride and serve as a funding source to sustain museum operations.

Amid the still-unfolding human and economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, the work of saving local history appears no less urgent.

Pinole's history can disappear from mainstream radar and from people's memories without a home for the artifacts and oral stories that define our city in all its diversity.

As a supporter of the Pinole History Museum, you are at the forefront of preserving the nearly 200-year history of Pinole and the important stories told by the city's ancestors.



Life in the time of Covid

Business owners optimistic 2021 will be a better year

ow has Covid-19 affected Pinole businesses?
What do they see for 2021?

Newsbriefs asked some of its advertisers about 2020 — and their thoughts about 2021. Their comments have been edited for space.

(NOTE: Pinole Paws and House of Lilith remain closed per state orders.)

How difficult was 2020 for your business?

- Very difficult. I went from having 25-30 clients a week to about 5-10. (Michelle Gonzalez, Massage by Michelle)
- There were lots of challenges in the real estate market! No open houses with lots of viewers, no flyers to pass out everything is virtual (tours, brochures, even document signing). But, challenges bring opportunities, and as we learned the technology and how to use it in the industry, we ended the year strong. (Scott Tuffnell, Office Manager, Windermere Rowland Realty)

- It was definitely a struggle both mentally and financially. Having to close and not knowing when I'd be able to reopen left me with an abundance of time to ride the emotional rollercoaster of fear, anger, and finally, surrender. Listening to friends and peers voicing their struggles was hard too, as many were/are in far more dire straits than me. (Angela Schneider, House of Lilith Hair Designers)
- It was scary in March and April. Then I got an Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) grant and later a loan, in case I needed backup funds, and that made me

breathe easier! Then Mechanics Bank came through with a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan in May that really saved the farm. The final blessing was Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) benefits, which are ongoing! Who knew this would go on SO LONG? (Deborah Jordan, Pinole Paws)

WHAT ADJUSTMENTS DID YOU MAKE TO STAY IN BUSINESS?

- I had to start doing some home visits, which are very time consuming. I made sure to wear my mask while in my office as well as wipe down everything after each client. (Michelle Gonzalez)
- The National Association of Realtors put out safe practices guidelines following Centers for Disease Control (CDC) protocols. That means no visitors (agents and deliveries only, we meet clients elsewhere) social distancing, and mandatory mask-wearing in the

Continued from page 8 office. We show homes virtually whenever possible, and do lots of Zoom meetings. (Scott Tuffnell)

- Business had dropped to almost 25% in the first few weeks of the shutdown, though it went up to about 50% of our previous business level eventually. Most customers are locals getting take-home food for the family; we aren't doing much business for large corporate meetings anymore. (Jennifer Cote, The New Deli)
- I closed the business but have slowly opened back up. I discontinued my advertisement in the Marketplace permanently. I now meet folks outside, with everyone wearing masks and following all protocols. (Debbie Ojeda, Saving Memories)
- · I Zoomed with my employees to see how they were doing, then in late May we met in person at the shop with our masks. By that time I had sourced Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for everyone, found good cleaning supplies, and we all had a pizza/deepclean party. We rearranged our workstations so everyone could physically distance. I, being the oldie, moved myself to the front of the shop, a whole wall between me and everyone else. We have yet to unlock our front door, but meet clients for pet drop-off and pick-up in the parking lot. (Deborah Jordan).
- Staying in contact with my customers and keeping them updated

on closures/openings, as well as selling hair-care products curbside. Also, I did some Zoom hair cutting tutorials to help people get through till I could serve them in person. (Angela Schneider)

• We implemented health and safety protocols with our guys so we could go out and perform our services in the safest way possible. We need to be sure we get our job done in a safe


manner, as a good portion of our business is being in people's homes or businesses in close proximity of the customers and their families. (Rob Baldwin, Kel-Aire)
