The PHS will share these videos on a film archive that we will establish, similar to the The Pioneers Film Archive on YouTube created by the


California Pioneers of Santa Clara (www.youtube.com/sccpioneers).

Compass and a Camera: A year in Vietnam BOOK CHRONICLES EXPERIENCES THROUGH PHOTOS



About the author:

Steven Burchik grew up in New York City and earned his bachelor's degree from Manhattan College during the turbulent sixties.

He worked his way through school, including a stint at the New York Daily News, and remained active on campus—even starting a second student newspaper to provide an outlet for students to voice different views.

After graduating, he entered the U.S. Army at the peak of the Vietnam War. He trained at various bases in the U.S., then spent a year in the rice paddies northeast of Saigon in the role of a forward observer as a sergeant with the 1st Infantry Division. He later earned his MBA from Michigan State University and had a successful career as a marketing executive and entrepreneur in the food industry.

Married with grown children, Burchik enjoys pursuing photography and sailing on San Francisco Bay. Compass and a Camera, his memoir of his Vietnam War experience, is his first book. ith a compass to direct him in his job as a forward observer and a personal camera to document his experiences—and keep him connected to his creative side—Vietnam veteran Steven Burchik was lucky enough to make it home and years later decided to write about the most challenging year of his life.

Like any experience, his year spent with the 1st Infantry Division stationed in the rice paddies near

Saigon included good times as well as bad. He candidly recalls how, although he believed communism to be a serious threat in the world, he soon learned that a guerilla war is a difficult one to fight, and survival rather than victory quickly became his focus. But he also remembers the exhilaration of helicopter rides over serpentine rivers and the time he introduced village kids to a gumball machine.

A unique memoir of the war, *Compass and a Camera* pulls not only from Burchik's memories, but also from the daily letters he wrote to his fiancée (she kept every single one) and includes numerous photographs from his collection of over four thousand. The images alone make this book a must-have for any history buff or fellow veteran.

NATIONAL PARK SERVICE HOSTS "GET ACTIVE ON THE BAY TRAIL"

isitors of all ages and fitness levels are invited to join National Park Service rangers for outdoor fitness and fun at 10 a.m. Saturday, December 13, at the Rosie the Riveter Memorial in Richmond, part of Rosie the Riveter/WWII Home Front National Historical Park. The Memorial is located in Marina Bay Park, at the intersection of Marina Bay Parkway and Melville Square.

NOTE: There is a detour on Marina Bay Parkway. For directions to the Rosie the Riveter Memorial, visit http://www.nps.gov/rori/planyourvisit/directions.htm, and scroll halfway down the page.

This free exercise program will feature stretches, outdoor exercises and games, all while learning more about healthy initiatives that began in the Richmond shipyards during WWII.

Reservations are not required for this event. Park Rangers are First Aid and CPR certified. All children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. All visitors are advised to wear comfortable clothing, closed-toed shoes and bring water. Sunscreen and snacks are not provided, so please bring your own. Programs will take place rain or shine, so please bring raingear.

Working in collaboration with the "Healthy Parks Healthy People Bay Area" initiative, Rosie the Riveter/World War II Home Front National Historical Park is hosting this program to encourage park visitors to make healthy lifestyle choices while spending more time outdoors.

You may purchase one or more of these books from us at the Pinole Farmers' Market-we'll be there every other Saturday through the end of December.






