he Pinole Historical Society has continued its "museum without walls" programming in 2014, offering community members quarterly programs featuring interesting speakers on localhistory topics, and fourth-grade students in Pinole schools an opportunity to learn about the city's history.

Sonny Jackson, a veteran artifact collector, regaled attendees at our May 2 membership meeting with his program, "Digging Up History: Artifacts from the Outhouses of Pinole."

Sonny brought bottles, coins, tokens, postcards, and other artifacts; all except the postcards were recovered during his local outhouse digs.



How about important athletic events, such as a high-school football, basketball, baseball, softball, or volleyball games?

Perhaps you have film of an important event that took place in Fernandez Park, or a ribbon cutting or an event that has a place in Pinole's history — such as the 1958 flood?

We're looking for any video or film you have — VHS, Beta, camcorder, DV tape, 8mm, Super 8mm,



16mm, 35mm, motion picture.

We want to collect, digitize, catalog, and preserve old movies on DVD (and whatever formats are to come) to exhibit, educate, and entertain.

recreation throughout Arizona and California — including the East Bay and El Cerrito.



You may purchase one or more of these books from us at the Pinole Farmers' Market-we'll be there every other Saturday through the end of December.






