NEW PINOLE BOOK NEAR COMPLETION

The second book about Pinole to be published by the Pinole Historical Society will be sent to the publisher by March 16.


Publisher Fonthill Media (www.fonthillmedia.com/), specializes in publishing books on general, local, and regional history.

An addition to Fonthill's "America Through Time" series, "Pinole Through Time" will feature 91 sets of photos of old Pinole buildings and landmarks and current photos of what exists on those sites today. In several cases these will be the same buildings, some restored and others nearly identical.

We expect the book will be delivered in mid to late September. A book signing in the Bank of Pinole building will be scheduled as soon as we get a firm delivery date.

The book signing will be held in a conjunction with a ceremony commemorating the 100th anniversary of the construction of the building, which opened in 1915.

The Pinole Historical Society is embarking on a major project to archive the city's history.

We want to establish a permanent, digitized collection of Pinole's history.

Do you have film of past Holy Ghost parades, Pinole Valley High School Homecoming parades, Memorial Day or July 4 parades?

How about important athletic events, such as a high-school football, basketball, baseball, softball, or volleyball games?

Perhaps you have film of an important event that took place in Fernandez Park, or a ribbon cutting or an event that has a place in Pinole's history — such as the 1958 flood?

We're looking for any video or film you have — VHS, Beta, camcorder, DV tape, 8mm, Super 8mm, 16mm, 35mm, motion picture.

We want to collect, digitize, catalog, and preserve old movies on DVD (and whatever formats are to come) to exhibit, educate, and entertain.

The PHS will share these videos on a film archive that we will establish, similar to the The Pioneers Film Archive on YouTube created by the

Steve Chamberlin and Doug Giffin of Education Matters, the owner of the campus, will discuss the historically sensitive restoration of the building and lead a tour.



Founded in 1923 and operating in El Cerrito from 1935 to 1954, the Chung Mei Home was the only such home for Chinese boys in the country. The building has been beautifully preserved over the years and has been deemed eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. Education Matters leases the campus to Summit Public Schools, which opened last August. We are inviting some of the 'Chung Mei boys' who lived at the home.

WOMEN PLAY LEADING ROLES IN WWII FILM SERIES

The National Park Service and the Richmond Museum Association announce a new film festival series aboard the SS Red Oak Victory, a beautifully restored cargo ship built in Richmond during World War II. The ship is owned and operated by the Richmond Museum Association and is also part of Rosie the Riveter/ WWII Home Front National Historical Park. Admission to the films is free, but there is a suggested donation of \$10 to help preserve and maintain the ship.

Four movies will be screened on Tuesdays as part of the “Women on the Home Front and Beyond Film Series.” Boarding begins at 6:30 PM and the films begin at 7 PM.

Tuesday, March 17: *Shining Through* (1992). Starring Melanie Griffith and Michael Douglas. Griffith plays a brave woman who goes undercover in Germany for the Allies to discover the secrets of the V2 rocket. This film is rated R; no one under 17 will be admitted without a parent.

Tuesday, April 14: *Force of Arms* (1951). William Holden, a soldier, and Nancy Olson, a nurse, find love during war.

Tuesday, May 12: *The Josephine Baker Story* (1991). Ingénue and ex-pat Josephine Baker stays in France during WWII and helps Jews escape the Nazis. This film is rated R; no one under 17 will be admitted without a parent.

The SS Red Oak Victory is located in historic Shipyard #3 at 1337 Canal Blvd., Berth 6A, in Richmond. For directions to the shipyard, visit the Red Oak Victory at www.ssredoakvictory.com/contact.htm.

Please note: The ship is not ADA accessible. Visitors must be able to climb the gangplank (40 feet of stairs with railings) and steep steps once aboard.

Remember to wear warm clothing, as it can be chilly aboard the ship!

Inclement weather may force the ship staff to cancel this program for safety reasons. If it rains, please call the ship at 510-237-2933 by 5:30 PM on the day of the screening to find out if the show will go on.

"Children of the Camps," a documentary film originally made and broadcast on PBS in 1999, portrays the poignant stories of six Japanese Americans who were interned as children in US concentration camps during WWII.

The film captures a three-day intensive group experience, during which the participants are guided by Dr. Satsuki Ina, a university professor and therapist, through a process that enables them to speak honestly about their experiences and the continuing impact of internment on their lives today.

Dr. Ina, who herself was born in the Tule Lake camp, will introduce and lead a Q&A at the 3/21 screening at 3 PM. Both screenings are free, however seating is limited, and reservations are required. You may purchase one or more of these books from us at the Pinole Farmers' Market—we'll be there every other Saturday through the end of December.






