

LIBRARY HONORED FOR HISTORIC PRESERVATION

The library provides the PHS with two exhibit cases, displays 23 photos of old Pinole on its walls, has done genealogy presentations with the society, and promotes PHS activities through the Friends of the Library quarterly newsletter.

The society's activities for the last year were summarized by Secretary Jo Ann Gannotti. They included:

- PHS volunteers introduced Pinole history to fourth-graders in five elementary schools with a one-hour program about the history and experiences of children in early Pinole schools at the turn of the 20th century.
- The PHS conducted its yearly history-essay contest in Pinole schools. All participants received certificates. Grand-prize winners received \$50 savings bonds and other prizes.
- Membership programs were held quarterly. One honored our "Rosies," women who

worked at the Kaiser Shipyards as Rosie the Riveters during World War II. A National Park Service Ranger presented a short program on the historical significance of the Rosie the Riveter/ World War II Home Front National Park, in Richmond. As a bonus, we met three "Rosies" who spoke about their experiences during that time.

• George Vincent regaled us with a second Old Town Walking Tour. It started at the Square Deal Garage and ended with a barbecue, compliments of Geoff Torretta at the Antlers Tavern. Inside, George and Geoff spoke about the history of the tavern. The walking tour was televised on Pinole Community TV and is archived on the city's website.

- The fourth annual PHS-sponsored Veterans Day Memorial and Flag Retirement Ceremony was held.
- PHS Newsbriefs, our printed newsletter, expanded to 16 pages with support from more than 50 advertisers. Additionally, a monthly electronic newsletter, premiered; it's sent to hundreds of people in the PHS database.

- The PHS organized the dedication of a bronze plaque to the Faria family, located at southeast corner of Henry Avenue and Pinole Valley Road, where the Kaiser Permanente Medical Office Building is located. This was the site of the Faria home, which was relocated to San Pablo Avenue in 2005.
- The PHS website www.PinoleHistorical Society.org kept people abreast of current activities and provided links to the city's history and walking tour, complete with a tour map.

BY-LAWS CHANGES RATIFIED

Article III, Section 2f: Membership dues for the ensuing year may be adjusted as recommended by the Board and ratified by the Members at the Annual Meeting to take effect January 1 of the next calendar year.

Article IV, Section 1: Reduce the number of Directors from nine to seven effective immediately; establishes requirement of one year of Society membership for any candidate for election or appointment to the Board.

Article IV, Section 3: Reduce the terms of Directors from three years to two years effective immediately. Present elections and continuing incumbents' terms are all adjusted.

Article IV, Section 7: Establish a limit of three unexcused absences from Board meetings in a calendar year subject to removal/replacement on the Board.

Article VI, Sections 2 and 3: The method of notifying members of regular and special meetings will be by E-mail and will also be posted on the Society's website and published in the Society's on-line and printed newsletters.


PHS SELLING PINOLE MEMORABILIA AT FARMERS' MARKET

One or more of these items will be on sale at each farmers' market. They are great additions to your history library and make wonderful gifts.














You may purchase one or more of these books from us at the Pinole Farmers' Market—we'll be there every other Saturday through the end of December.






