
THE LIFE AND TIMES OF BERNARDO FERNANDEZ

he life of Bernardo Fernandez, one of the business and civic pioneers in the early history of Pinole, will be the subject of the Pinole Historical Society's Friday, May 12, meeting from 6:30 to 8 PM in conference rooms 2A and 2B of the Kaiser Permanente Medical Office Building, 1301 Pinole Valley Road. The public is invited to this free event. Refreshments will be served.

Susan Fernandez, the great-granddaughter of her family's patriarch, who arrived in Pinole in 1853 and was a giant of the business community for nearly 60 years until his death in 1912, will be the presenter.

The program will cover Bernardo's boyhood and early life in his hometown of Villa da Figueira (now Figueira da Foz), Portugal, his journey to America, and his life and marriage to Carlotta Cuadra.

inole Historical Society co-founder and historian George Vincent's long-awaited book, "School Bells and Ink Wells: a History of the Early Schools of Pinole, 1865-1968," has been published and is for sale.

The 124-page book, featuring more than 150 photos, some never-before seen, chronicles the history of the Fitzgerald Ranch School (1865-1886), Plaza School (1886-1906), and Pinole-Hercules School #1 (1906-1966).

The book is filled with stories and amusing anecdotes, and anyone who went to school in Pinole will treasure this fond memory of their early education.

The book brings to light the workings and people that made the Pinole-Hercules Union School District the envy of surrounding townships.

Hill School alumni are fiercely loyal to their "green school" that stood atop Samuel Street in Pinole until 1968. There is a shared pride of camaraderie understood only by those who bore the trials of the daily uphill climb to the creaking stairs and dark halls haunted by the strict stares of lurking teachers.



RICHMOND MUSEUM OF HISTORY EXHIBITION HOW WORLD WAR I CHANGED RICHMOND

March 11 – June 29

he Richmond Museum of History will host the exhibition "How World War I Changed Richmond" in the museum's Seaver Gallery, 400 Nevin Avenue, Richmond.

The exhibit features dozens of World War I-related artifacts with connections to Richmond. Many artifacts have been in the museum collection more than 50 years and will be on display for the first time.

The exhibit commemorates the centennial of the United States involvement in the Great War and is one of the few events marking the centennial in the San Francisco Bay Area. It features stories of Richmond residents from all walks of life who were involved in World War I, both at home and on the front.

Visitors to the exhibit will learn how World War I shaped the City of Richmond to be ready to face the challenges of the World War II Home Front and beyond.

SAN FRANCISCO MARITIME NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK HOSTS SPECIAL EVENTS FOR ASIAN PACIFIC AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH

SATURDAY, MAY 6

Chinatown's Maritime Stories

10 AM. Meets at Portsmouth Square/Ends at Hyde St. Pier. Free

Walk with a ranger through Chinatown to the Park. You'll learn about the role Chinese American laborers played in the birth of San Francisco, the Chinese Exclusion Act (and its lingering effect on today's Chinese community), and how workers hired out of Chinatown sailed aboard the ship Balclutha to Alaska's salmon canneries during the early 20th century.

Film Screening of "Dogpatch Ranch"

1-3:30 PM, at the Visitor Center, 499 Jefferson Street. Free

This film tells the story of Glenn Lym's Chinese great grandfather and grandmother, and the seven children they raised on a ranch in the late 1800s in Dogpatch, the Potrero, San Francisco. How and why did they raise their family in an outlying neighborhood instead of in Chinatown? This was a time of intense anti-Chinese sentiment; some answers spin out in the lives of their children and suggest an unexpected interface between early Chinese entrepreneurs and San Francisco's business elite tied to the Pacific Ocean trade and to the railroads.

SATURDAY, MAY 13

The Sea of Invisible Riches: Asian Americans and the Alaska Salmon Grounds, 1880-1929 11AM-12 PM, Hyde Street Pier. Subject to ship admission fee.

Explore the role Asian Americans played in the struggle for immigration rights in the decades bordering 1900. This journey took place on the vast arctic coast and ocean of Alaska and the Northeast Pacific. Along the way, learn how Asian Americans captured the invisible ecological and environmental riches of the sea – which Europeans were still in the process of understanding.

SUNDAY, MAY 28

Chance and Fair Play: A Dialogue about Maritime Equality and Opportunity

1-3 PM, at the Visitor Center, 499 Jefferson Street. Free

This facilitated dialogue program includes a talk and illustrated presentation about the ship Balclutha as well as an audience-driven discussion of equality and opportunity from the Asian Pacific American Cannery Worker perspective. Come and share your thoughts and connect stories of the ship to experiences in your own life.

ONGOING EXHIBITS

The San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park has a variety of ongoing exhibits that focus on the Asian American experience. Look for the Grace Quan at the small boat dock on Hyde Street Pier, an example of the small craft that Chinese immigrants used to catch shrimp in San Francisco Bay. At the park Visitor Center, exhibits bring to life stories of 19th century Chinese immigration.

San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park is located at the west end of Fisherman's Wharf in San Francisco. The park includes a magnificent fleet of historic ships, Visitor Center, Maritime Museum, Maritime Research Center, and Aquatic Park Historic District.

Every year we see more American flags being displayed for community and special events.

On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed the Flag Resolution which stated: "Resolved, that the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Francis Hopkinson, of New Jersey, a naval flag designer and a signer of the Declaration of Independence, designed the 1777 flag.

The original flag has been modified 26 times and was unchanged with its 48 stars for 47 years, beginning with Arizona's and New Mexico's admittance to the Union on July 4, 1912. On January 3, 1959, when Alaska was admitted to the Union, the number of stars increased to 49. On August 21, 1959, when Hawaii was admitted to the Union, the flag showed 50 stars.

Other flag holidays include Inauguration Day (every four years), election days, state and local holidays, Admission Day, and others proclaimed by the President of the United States.


