

#### **Maritime Contra Costa**

Carol A. Jensen, author of *Maritime Contra Costa County*, will be the speaker at our Friday, November 7, meeting in conference rooms 1A and 1B of the the Kaiser Permanente Medical Office Building, 1301 Pinole Valley Road.

This event is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be served.

Carol is the vice president of the Contra Costa Historic Landmark Advisory Committee, and a member of the California Historical Society, Contra Costa County Historical Society, East Contra Costa Historical Society, and John Marsh Historic Trust.



San Francisco's "opposite shore" played a significant maritime role in securing the city's financial preeminence. Contra Costa County provided deepwater ports for shipping agricultural, mineral, and manufactured goods around the world. Pacific commodity traders made use of these ports to ship products, ensuring California's unique global economic role.

Immense wealth was created from goods shipped from maritime Contra Costa County, securing a vibrant economy from the Gaslight Era to the days of Haight-Ashbury.

### **Veterans Day**

The sixth annual Veterans Day Memorial and Flag Retirement Ceremony will be held Tuesday, November 11, at 11 a.m. in Fernandez Park.

The event will feature Boy Scout Troop 86, West Contra Costa Girl Scouts, Veterans of Foreign Wars, several local schools, the Pinole Valley High School Marching Band, Pinole Youth Commissioners, and elected officials.

Songs, speeches, remembrances, and tributes will highlight the hour-long ceremony, which concludes

retired with proper respect. There is no charge to have a flag retired.

Hostilities between the Allied nations and Germany that ended World War I went into effect at 11 a.m. on November 11, 1918 —

the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, Veterans Day in the United States is commemorated at 11 a.m. on November 11 every year.

## PHS WILL PUBLISH NEW BOOK IN FALL 2015


he Pinole Historical Society will see its second book on the history of Pinole published in the fall of 2015.

The society has a signed a contract with Fonthill Media (*www.fonthillmedia.com/*), a specialist book-publishing company in the areas of general history, local and regional history, military history, transport history, and biography.

The society will be producing *Pinole Through Time*, a title in Fonthill's *America Through Time* series. The book will feature photos of old Pinole buildings and landmarks and current photos of what exists on those sites today. In several cases it will be the same building, some restored and others nearly identical.

The Pinole Historical Society is embarking on a major project to archive the city's history.

We want to establish a permanent, digitized collection of Pinole's history.

Do you have film of past Holy Ghost parades, Pinole Valley High School Homecoming parades, Memorial Day or July 4 parades?

How about important athletic events, such as a high-school football, basket-

ball, baseball, softball, or volleyball games?

Perhaps you have film of an important event that took place in Fernandez Park, or a ribbon cutting or an event that has a place in Pinole's history — such as the 1958 flood?

We're looking for any video or film you have — VHS, Beta, camcorder, DV tape, 8mm, Super 8mm, 16mm, 35mm, motion picture.



Nearly everyone has taken home movies. That makes everyone who has taken film a historian.

We want to collect, digitize, catalog, and preserve old movies on DVD (and whatever formats are to come) to exhibit, educate, and entertain.

The PHS will share these videos on a film archive that we will establish, similar to the The Pioneers Film Archive on YouTube created by the

California Pioneers of Santa Clara (www.youtube.com/sccpioneers).



## "Get Active on the Bay Trail: A Victory for Health"

FITNESS EVENT ENCOURAGES PEOPLE TO GET OUTSIDE, LEARN HISTORY, AND EXERCISE IN A NATIONAL PARK

V isitors of all ages and fitness levels are invited to join National Park Service rangers for outdoor fitness and fun on Saturday, October 1, at 12:30 PM at the Rosie the Riveter Memorial in Marina Bay Park, Richmond, at the intersection of Marina Bay Parkway and Melville Square.

The Memorial is part of the Rosie the Riveter/WWII Home Front National Historical Park.

**Please note:** There is a detour on Marina Bay Parkway. For directions to the Memorial, visit *www.nps.gov/rori/planyourvisit/directions.htm*, scroll halfway down the page, and follow directions to The Rosie the Riveter Memorial.


This free 30-minute program, called "Get Active on the Bay Trail: A Victory for Health," will include stretches, outdoor exercises, and games, and participants will learn about healthy initiatives that began during WWII in the Richmond Shipyards. Rangers will also lead exercises and activities at Lucretia Edwards Park, at the end of Marina Way South, Richmond, from 2-3 PM.

Reservations are not required for this program. All children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. All visitors are advised to wear comfortable clothing and closed-toed shoes, and bring water. Sunscreen and snacks are not provided, so please bring your own.

The Rosie the Riveter Visitor Education Center, 1414 Harbour Way South, suite 3000, Richmond, is open seven days a week from 10 AM to 5 PM. For more information and directions to the Visitor Education Center, please call (510) 232-5050 x0 or visit



Turning Points

The four films in this series represent four crucial turning points during WWII that led to Allied victory. Films will be shown aboard the historic SS Red Oak Victory on the dates below.

#### ■ The Battle of Britain(1969)

#### September 18 at 7pm

This is the story of England's "finest hour" when a vastly outnumbered Royal Air Force desperately fends off the vaunted German Luftwaffe. Starring Sir Lawrence Olivier and a great ensemble cast of British actors.

#### Enigma (2001)

#### October 16 at 7pm

Against a back drop of espionage and mystery, Kate Winslet and Dougray Scott struggle to break the German code that will give the Allies a critical edge during WWII. This film is rated R; no one under 17 will be admitted without a parent.

#### ■ The Heroes of Telemark (1965)

#### November 20 at 7pm

Kirk Douglas and Richard Harris lead a team of Norwegian saboteurs who prevent the Germans from obtaining a supply of heavy water needed for the development of an atomic bomb.

#### ■ Fat Man and Little Boy (1989)

#### December 18 at 7pm

Paul Newman leads the team of Manhattan Project scientists in the development of the first atomic bombs.

You may purchase one or more of these books from us at the Pinole Farmers' Market-we'll be there every other Saturday through the end of December.






