PHS WILL PUBLISH NEW BOOK IN FALL 2015


he Pinole Historical Society will see its second book on the history of Pinole published in the fall of 2015.

The society has a signed a contract with Fonthill Media (*www.fonthillmedia.com/*), a specialist book-publishing company in the areas of general history, local and regional history, military history, transport history, and biography.

The society will be producing *Pinole Through Time*, a title in Fonthill's *America Through Time* series. The book will feature photos of old Pinole buildings and landmarks and current photos of what exists on those sites today. In several cases it will be the same building, some restored and others nearly identical.

The Pinole Historical Society is embarking on a major project to archive the city's history.

We want to establish a permanent, digitized collection of Pinole's history.

Do you have film of past Holy Ghost parades, Pinole Valley High School Homecoming parades, Memorial Day or July 4 parades?

How about important athletic events, such as a high-school football, basketball, baseball, softball, or volleyball games?

Perhaps you have film of an important event that took place in Fernandez Park, or a ribbon cutting or an event that has a place in Pinole's history — such as the 1958 flood?

We're looking for any video or film you have — VHS, Beta, camcorder, DV tape, 8mm, Super 8mm, 16mm, 35mm, motion picture.



Nearly everyone has taken home movies. That makes everyone who has taken film a historian.

We want to collect, digitize, catalog, and preserve old movies on DVD (and whatever formats are to come) to exhibit, educate, and entertain.

The PHS will share these videos on a film archive that we will establish, similar to the The Pioneers Film Archive on YouTube created by the

California Pioneers of Santa Clara (www.youtube.com/sccpioneers).

Film connects with the past in a unique way. It's immersive, educational, and entertaining. It's a way to get young people interested in history.

The exhibit is a collaboration of Bay Area quilt enthusiasts, arts organizations, museums, historical associations, The Rosie the Riveter Trust, and National Park Service staff and volunteers.

The quilts were initially exhibited at the Craneway Pavilion in March during "Voices in Cloth," a quilt show produced by the East Bay Heritage Quilters.



Public programs with featured quilters will take place on Saturday, October 11, and Saturday, November 15, at 11 AM.

PLEASE NOTE: Theater seating for each event is limited to the first 48 visitors; please arrive early to get a seat.

The park's Visitor Education Center at at 1414 Harbour Way South, Suite 3000, Richmond, is open seven days a week from 10 AM to 5 PM.

IN COLLABORATION WITH SAN FRANCISCO MARITIME NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK

Event kicks off in Richmond on September 5

hree unique programs will retrace this forgotten history in an interdisciplinary research and art expedition on the Grace Quan, a 43-foot replica of a 19th century San Francisco Bay shrimp junk.

Over two weeks in September, it will sail to former Chinese shrimping sites in a route that links San Rafael in the North Bay, Richmond in the East Bay, Redwood City in the South Bay, and San Francisco.

A team of visual, sound, and media artists will chronicle the voyage, scientists from the San Francisco Estuary Institute will provide environmental commentary during the sails, and National Park Service's John C. Muir, who led the building of the Park's Grace Quan, will be our skipper.

Free, land-side public programs will connect local communities

and heritage to the history of Chinese shrimp fishing in the Bay. Each program will be a distinct, unforgettable experience.

The journey kicks off at the Craneway Pavilion on the Richmond waterfront on Friday, September 5, from 10:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., with tours of the Grace Quan, and a program of presentations including sights and surround-sound from the sails, Richmond's little-known Chinese shrimp camps, building of the Grace Quan, and Bay historical ecology.

Next is a community gathering on Saturday, September 13, from 12:30 to 3:30 p.m., at the EcoCenter at Heron's Head Park, a hidden urban gem at a thriving salt marsh in San Francisco's India Basin. Learn about the diverse history of Bayview Hunters Point, hear community

memories, and watch a sailing demonstration by the Grace Quan. Enjoy lunch with local specialties, hosted by the Bayview Historical Society.

The expedition's conclusion will be Sunday, September 14, from 2 to 5 p.m., at China Camp Village, the only remaining historic site of the former Chinese shrimping camps around the Bay. Enjoy a magical afternoon with lion dancers at the dock, expedition tales, and a pop-up sound installation, and honor this forgotten history in a ceremonial walk of remembrance.

Bay Chronicles will culminate in a trans-media installation at the San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park in 2015, drawing together threads from diverse sources to recover forgotten history and reconnect communities with place.

In light of the recent earthquakes shaking our homes, Pinole Police Department Community Safety Specialist Pete Janke compiled this basic emergency preparedness kit list. The kit is easy to prepare. Basic Emergency Preparedness Kit* Pinole Police Department Community Preservation & Safety Unit



Before the Emergency

Prepare it now, not after the emergency occurs. Store your kit in a place that will not be buried in the event of an earthquake or other disaster. This is an example kit. It should last a minimum of 72 hours. Add any items you feel are needed.

Kit Supplies

- Food Canned goods to include meats; high protein breakfast or granola bars;
 canned or dried fruit; and canned or powdered milk. (Twinkies only last 45 days!)
- Can opener, pocket knife, portable utensils and plates (We're going camping.)
- Water 1 gallon per person per day
- Paper products moist towlettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation (Sounds yucky until you will need it.)
- Medications you might need and personal hygiene kits
- First Aid kit (stock it up)
- Baby supplies
- Pet food
- Clothing the heavy stuff in case it is cold. At least one change of clothes.
- Blankets for each person
- Sleeping bags (one for each person) & that pillow you can't seem to throw away
- Flashlights (buy a box of batteries)
- Portable radio (buy a box of batteries). Try using it.
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter in place
- The big wrench to turn off the gas and water
- A list (yes, that paper stuff) of important phone numbers your cell may not work

Items you might want to add to your kit

- Tent
- Rain gear
- · Cash, traveler's checks, change
- Fire Extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Signal flares
- Paper and pencils (do you remember what to do with this stuff?)

Remember all those important documents you planned to put in a waterproof container? It is time to do it.

Designate a person outside your area as the one to call when the big one happens.

You may purchase one or more of these books from us at the Pinole Farmers' Market-we'll be there every other Saturday through the end of December.






