



President's Message

Jeff Rubin, President, Pinole Historical Society and Pinole History Museum REMEMBERING PAUL MARIOTTI



aul Mariotti was a character, and I mean this in a most complimentary way. He was among the staunchest supporters of Pinole's history, and of the Pinole Historical Society.

So it was with shock and sadness that I learned of his passing on September 9 at age 58.

Among the many fond memories I have of Paul is spending time learning about Pinole, listening to his advice on how to

promote local history, and his unquenchable gusto when asking people to fork up some money for the society and the proposed museum.

In the midst of a 2022 celebration honoring Mayor Vincent Salimi held on the lawn of his home, the Fernandez Mansion, Paul unabashedly went from table to table asking for donations. I chuckled, but appreciated his gesture.

He frequently appeared at the historical society booth at the Pinole Farmers' Market, offering marketing and PR suggestions or tips on how to sell more books.

Above all, he was just a nice, kind man.

Another shock was learning that Paul's estate plan contained a bequest of \$20,000 to the Pinole Historical Society. Words can't describe my mixed feelings as I accepted this extraordinarily generous gift at the October 14 Pinole History Museum Fundraising Dinner.

Rest in peace, Paul. And thank you. For everything.

In memoríam

Paul Mariotti

June 8, 1965 - September 9, 2023 Age 58

Paul Joseph Mariotti, the second of four children born to Dr. Joe and Gretchen Mariotti, passed away peacefully in his sleep on September 9, 2023, after a

six-month battle with a Glioblastoma brain tumor.

Paul had a wonderful childhood growing up in the historic Fernandez Mansion in Pinole. He played in the mud on the Bayfront shore, swung on a rope swing off eucalyptus trees over the railroad tracks, and helped raise chickens, ducks, geese, peacocks, pigs, donkeys, and cows on the property. Paul loved horses and was an



avid rider. He loved rodeos, his cowboy hat, two-step dancing, and charming the ladies.

Paul attended Bethel Christian Academy, Salesian High School, Cal State-Chico, University of Massachusetts, San Francisco State University, the Beijing Language Institute, as well as Thunderbird Global School of Management.

Paul, like the rest of the Mariotti family, loved to travel. He traveled the world with his family and on his own, visiting more than 40 countries over the years. He learned, and spoke, German, Chinese, and Russian languages.

He was an integral part of both Dr. Joe's and Gretchen Mariotti's campaigns for Pinole City Council. He was a member of the Pinole Horseman Society, an avid supporter of the Pinole Historical Society, and supported his father in the Pinole Creek and Coastal cleanup initiatives.

In recent years he could be seen frequenting Pinole local businesses with his trusted German Shepard companion, Bernie.

Memorial services were held October 15 in the front yard of the Fernandez Mansion.



OUR RANCHO HISTORY

he Rancho period is an important part of our local history.

Rancho El Pinole, as well as Rancho San Pablo, were instrumental as two of the first in creating a major part of what we know today as Contra Costa County.

In 1823, two pioneers had been granted deeds to tracts of land for their years of service as *soldados* (soldiers) in the Royal Army of Spain at the presidio of San Francisco.

RANCHO EL PINOLE

Comandante Don Ygnacio Nicanor Martínez, one of the most aristocratic of the Spanish dons of early California, was chief military officer, serving 12 years at the presidio at Yerba Buena (renamed San Francisco in 1848) under the Spanish Royal Army.

At the time he petitioned for a tract of land

on the Contra Costa (the opposite coast), he made his home at the pueblo de San José. In 1823 he received his grant of 17,761 acres, deeded to him by Governor Luís Antonio Argüello, (which he named Rancho de Nuestra Senora de la Merced). The grant was formalized on June 1, 1842, by Governor Juan B. Alvarado and confirmed by the U.S. government on January 16, 1852.

Rancho El Pinole extended over land that today includes most of the Franklin Ridge and towns of Crockett, Hercules, Martinez, Oleum, Pinole, Rodeo, Selby, and Tormey along the Carquinez Strait in present-day Contra Costa County. The town of Martinez was named for Don Ygnacio Nicanor Martínez.

Don Francisco María Castro was the third son of Joaquin Ysidro de Castro (one of the founding settlers of the Pueblo

of San José) and María Marina Botiller. Francisco had come as a boy with his family to California from México with the De Anza Expedition in 1775.

RANCHO SAN PABLO

A former soldier at the San Francisco Presidio and one-time *alcalde* (mayor) of the Pueblo de San José, Castro petitioned for and was granted Rancho San Pablo in 1823, a 17,939-acre tract of land in present-day Contra Costa County by Governor Luís Antonio Argüello.

The San Pablo grant covered what is now Richmond, San Pablo, El Cerrito, and Kensington in western Contra Costa County.

The land had previously been grazing land for cattle belonging to *Continued on page 9*

Mission San Francisco de Asís, but was secularized by the new Mexican republic.

Castro and his family moved to the rancho sometime after 1824.

The grant was reconfirmed by Governor José Figueroa in 1834 to the heirs of Francisco Castro.

PIONEERS ARRIVE

What started with two historic pioneers, the Castro-Alvarado and Martínez families, the area soon expanded into what we know today as Contra Costa County.

As more and more people came here to live, from as far as Europe and other countries, they soon had farms with livestock, planting orchards — introducing new crops that grew in the rich California soil.


They helped improve the area with their agricultural knowledge and skills, and the Spanish *vaqueros* (horsemen) were among the most respected, as their reputation with equestrian gear had been unparalleled.

CITIES DEVELOP

Soon other important merchants and their businesses were established, like blacksmiths, dry good establishments, and hotels for travelers. Residents were now needing churches, schools, hospitals, grocery stores, and new roads that would lead to their newly built homes and businesses.

Committees were formed, then town councils, and before long, an established form of government for its citizens.

Without these Rancho pioneers, our Bay Area as we know it probably would not exist.



HISTORY COMES ALIVE ON THE PHS YOUTUBE CHANNEL


Recent Pinole Historical Society programs have been uploaded to the society's YouTube channel, including the May 12 presentation by PHS co-founder George Vincent, "Candles of History: Celebrating 200 Years of the Heydays and Remnants of the Rancho El Pinole."

This special program commemorated the 200th anniversary of the 1823 El Pinole Grant awrded to retired Mexican soldier Ygnacio Martínez, who built his adobe rancho on land that now encompasses Pinole Valley Park.

The new programs added to our

channel also include the September and November 2022 programs by Cal State-East Bay professor John Robinson and representatives from the Contra Costa History Center in Martinez.
