PINOLE CITY COUNCIL APPROVES FARIA HOUSE RENOVATION

n June 7, 2022, the council approved hazard remediation and renovations of the Faria House to create a lower-level office space and upper-level warm shell — a partial renovation.

The measure approved by the council states work is scheduled to be completed by June 2023.

The council has not decided for what purpose the Faria House will be used.

Description: The building commonly referred to as the "Faria House" is a two-story residence constructed in about 1890 and originally located at what is now 1301 Pinole Valley Road. In 2005, the Faria House was relocated to 2100 San Pablo Avenue. On June 7, 2022, City Council directed staff pursue hazard remediation and renovations to create a lower-level office, and upper-level warm shell. The first step is the site remediation to removal all hazardous materials (i.e., asbestos and/or lead based paint) from the first and second floors. This will involve removal of all interior baseboard, door, window trim, lath and plaster (from the cellings and walls). This will also include removal of all lighting and plumbing fixtures, kitchen "built-in-place" cabinets. Once the site remediation is complete, the lower level of the structure will be ready for tenant improvement for an office use. The upper level will be a warm shell, which means that the upper level will be fully insulated, with walls open and ceiling covered with wallboard, but no other improvements beyond the hazard mitigation work. The upper level would be separated from the lower level with secured "temporary" framing and wallboard partition wall built at the top of the stairs. The lower level will have rough electrical, plumbing, and mechanical installation for an office use. All lower-level rooms would have new wall and ceiling insulation installed and covered with new drywall. The kitchen would remain in the same location, the dining room, which would become the conference room/meeting room would include low-voltage, data, communications for teleconferencing, meetings, the existing bathroom would become a single All Gender restroom, renovated to meet ADA compliance, the existing rooms would become office suites with new electrical sub-panel, rough electrical, rough plumbing and rough mechanical installed. Lower-level rooms will have renewed (or new) flooring, baseboard, and doors etc.

President's Message

Jeff Rubin, President, Pinole Historical Society and Pinole History Museum

LARGE DONATION, SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS — AND 2022 IS ONLY HALF OVER

here is lots of good news to share, not the least of which is the Pinole City Council included funding for the partial renovation of the historic Faria House in the 2022-23 budget. The details are on the front page.

This is a good first step toward the goal of establishing a museum in the Faria House. The council has not decided on a use for the house, so it's important to let the council members know you want a museum there.

With so many historic buildings that dotted Old Town replaced by modern structures that altered the city's distinctive architectural character, I'm grateful this historic home will be saved and enjoyed by the community.

MAJOR GIFT, MAJOR THANK YOU

One of the most humbling and rewarding experiences in the non-profit world is when an unexpected gift is received. Especially a large gift.

This happened to the Pinole History Museum on July 1 when the museum received a \$2,487.80 donation from former Pinole City Councilman and Mayor Tim Banuelos.

Tim is an architect and served on the council from 2009 to 2018. He serves now as a Planning Commissioner, just as he did before joining the council 13 years ago.

This money was the remainder of the funds in Tim's city council campaign account, which by law he had to close and distribute to a non-profit (or more than one). Tim and his wife, Kim, chose the PHM as the sole recipient.

"The history of Pinole is important to everyone, and sometimes people don't even know it," Tim says. "I've been here a long time, and there are a lot of things that have been lost, so it's really

important to preserve what we have now.

"We hope this (gift) pushes us a little closer to the opening of a museum in the near future," Tim added. "Kim and I wanted to make sure we could play a small part in making that happen."

AUTHOR RECALLS PONY CART & PUP

had to face facts.

I was unlikely to own
a horse ranch any
time soon.

There would be no new pony to pull our pony cart and no old barn to store it in. After 60 years, our family home on Savage Avenue in Pinole would be sold soon! Our 160-year-old pony cart hanging in the rafters of the garage needed a new home!

My sister, Karen, and I had loved the stories our dad, Puppy Kole, told us about his childhood in Sonora, in California's Gold Country. He had won a pony by selling newspaper subscriptions. Then he convinced a lovely old lady to sell him her treasured little black and yellow pony cart.

When we moved to Pinole in 1962, he quickly got us a pony. We trained Lucky to pull that same pony cart. We spent endless happy hours pulling neighborhood kids up and down our dead-end street.

We caught "parade

fever" with the Fiesta del Pinole. The kids on our street entered the parade dressed as Native Americans one year and the Pedro Fages Spanish exploration party the next. Lucky and Drodie, our dog, were incorporated in the entourage.

In a later parade, wearing pioneer dresses and sunbonnets made by our mom, Karen and I entered with Lucky and the cart.

Lucky and the pony cart made their last public appearance in 1970 on the first Earth Day. We arrived in style for Pinole Valley High School's Smog Free Locomotion Day. All the horse kids kept our horses tied up in a field where the library is now. We took turns cutting classes to watch over them.

I enjoyed telling stories about my dad's child-hood, as well as our childhood in Pinole. After I retired from teaching, I no longer had a captive audience. Then I found Orinda Talespinners,

which is affiliated with the Storytelling Association of California, to regale with my tales. Spinnng a good tale was just the skill I needed to rescue our pony cart.

We contacted the Tuolumne County Museum in Sonora to see if they'd be interested in our pony cart. At first, they were cautious and businesslike.

A museum has much to consider in taking on large items like antique pony carts. When they asked for specifics, I knew that bare facts would not be the deciding factors.

I wrote stories about my dad, his pony, and the cart. I shared old family photos illustrating the stories. The stories caught their interest and helped them understand the place our cart held in Sonora's history.

They helped us research the identity of the old lady who sold the cart to our dad. They recognized the networks of relationships which

I knew in my heart that our cart could be a museum focal point where story after story could be carried along on its old yellow wheels. I find the stories of yesterday naturally lead people to value their own stories today.

With the clock ticking on the sale of our family home, we finally heard that the museum accepted our pony cart! It is now on display, back in its original Sonora home!

We continue to update the museum with additional information and have been invited to events. They published our stories in their quarterly journal, *Chispa*.

Friends and family have visited the museum. More plan to travel there to visit the cart. We plan to hold a reunion at the museum to celebrate and let more stories roll. It has been fun and deeply rewarding to work with the museum staff.

All the storytelling, writing, and photo collecting led our friend, Myra Silverman, to decide the story of my pony cart would make a great little book.

Karen, Myra, and I took delight collaborating on "Pup's Pony Cart."

The interest and support from friends and family was gratifying. But the responses from the Tuolumne County and Oakland museums, the Oakland Library, the Tuolumne County Archives, and community groups like the Orinda Talespinners and the Pinole Historical Society, really made the book a success!

PHS AND PHM COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

inole Valley High School students Justin Trujillo and Olivia Lubinger received \$500 college scholarships from the Pinole Historical Society (PHS) and Pinole History Museum (PHM) at the school's June 2 senior awards assembly.

Justin Trujillo, who will study music education at Sacramento State University, received the PHS's George R. Vincent Scholarship.

The scholarship is named after longtime Pinole teacher George R. Vincent, a co-founder of the Pinole Historical Society and author of several books about the history of Pinole and its people.

Justin participated in the historical society's "Diversifying Pinole History" project in summer 2021, in which three high-school students with a shared curiosity for history, storytelling, civic engagement, journalism, social impact, and diversity interviewed minority business owners in Pinole to chronicle their stories in print, in photos, and in videos.

Justin's video about Sue Bermejo, who opened Sue's Place, a Filipino-American breakfast and lunch restaurant in the space formerly occupied by The Alley Cafe, is archived on the PHS YouTube channel. This outstanding work captures the essence of small-business life in Pinole.

Olivia Lubinger, headed to UC-San Diego to study human biology,

was the first recipient of the PHM's Dr. Joseph R. Mariotti Scholarship.

The scholarship is named after the late Dr. Mariotti, who co-founded the Pinole Historical Society and long worked for a museum for Pinole's history.

Dr. Joe was an orthopedic surgeon and the team doctor for the PVHS football team.

Dr. Joe and late wife, Gretchen, made the Fernandez Mansion their home. Their family still lives there.

Olivia was the first participant in the museum's "Oral History Project," designed to give students an opportunity to learn more about their family history and contribute to the museum's archives.

Olivia interviewed her mother, who grew up in Pinole in the 1970s and 1980s. The video is archived on the PHS YouTube channel.
