– October 14 Pinole History Museum dinner – PETE MURRAY TO BE HONORED FOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO CITY'S HISTORY

Pete Murray, longtime Pinole City Councilman – and seven-time Mayor – will be honored for his contributions to the city and its history at the Pinole History Museum Fundraising Dinner Saturday, October 14, from 6-9 p.m. in the Family Life Center of Valley Bible Church, 1477 Willow Avenue, Hercules.


"Back to the Rancho" is the theme of this year's Pinole History Museum fundraising dinner, commemorating the 200th anniversary of the 1823 El Pinole Grant to retired Mexican soldier Ygnacio Martínez, who built his Rancho El Pinole adobe homestead on what is now Pinole Valley Park.

The event will feature a great sit-down catered dinner by Back Forty Texas BBQ and a fabulous raffle and silent auction.

Pete served on the Pinole City Council from 1992-2020. His 28 years of service is the second-longest tenure of a council member in the city's history, tied with Edward M. Downer, founder of the Bank of Pinole, who served from 1910-1938.

Louis Ruff, a mid-20th century merchant, served 33 years (1922-1955).



President's Message

Jeff Rubin, President, Pinole Historical Society and Pinole History Museum FARIA HOUSE TO BE SOLD; MUSEUM PIVOTS TO NEW OBJECTVE



Pinole City Council voted to begin taking steps to sell the Faria House. It was a 4-1 vote: Mayor Devin Murphy, Mayor Pro-Tem Maureen Toms, and Councilmembers Cameron Sasai and Anthony Tave voted yes; Councilmember Norma Martínez-Rubin voted no.

n July 18, the

It's unfortunate this city council does not recognize the enduring value of having a museum and

what it could mean to the city and region culturally and economically. Historical context should matter in decisions that affect a community, yet the July 18 staff report, a public document, did not mention:

• The Faria House was purchased with the express intent and promise made to the Faria sisters and their families — and by extension the community — that it would be renovated and used as a museum.

• In 2007, after it was moved downtown and renovation was funded, then-Mayor Maria Alegria told the *West County Times*, "We've worked long and hard to preserve our history in Old Town. "(Having the museum) allows us to acknowledge our history and share it with future generations, not only in Pinole but all of Contra Costa County."

Previous city councils for nearly two decades took official actions, and meeting minutes affirmed the city's intent to establish a museum in the Faria House. In 2019-20, the city spent more than *Continued on page 4*

Continued from page 3 \$100,000 to hire an architect to design a renovation of the Faria House, specifically for its use as a museum. In 2020, the city proffered a lease agreement to the Pinole History Museum, though good-faith efforts to work with the PHM were quashed by one councilmember's vote.

What previous councils had in common was an ethic of honoring their word and progressively working toward accomplishments of various projects, while monitoring economic swings affecting the city's budgets. They also valued the city's history and the people who care about it, knowing that pursuing city goals ought not to deny promises made in the past.

Sadly, the current council thinks differently.

NEW OBJECTIVES

With the Faria House not an option for a physical museum, the PHM board of directors is refocusing its efforts to make the city's history available and accessible for our residents and the public.

We will be creating:

• A virtual museum, with multiple online exhibits;

• A smartphone app that will include a tour of historic sites, homes, businesses, and people in our city's history, with oral histories and recorded information; • Pop-up exhibit installations in local businesses and schools. The first exhibit was installed at Mechanics Bank this spring.

We will catalogue and digitize our entire collection of documents, photographs, memorabilia, and artifacts. Freelance museum professionals and an app developer will be hired.

Museums across the United States and the world have established or are working on establishing a virtual presence, as the museum industry adapts to the digital and post-COVID world.

Usually this is done after a

physical museum exists; we are doing it in reverse order as we continue to seek a home.

People, families, and communities are shaped by history. If their stories are not told, if their history is not preserved, their stories and their history become something else — forgotten.

Our mission to enhance the preservation and collection of artifacts that represent Pinole history and culture ... (that) will educate and inspire Pinole residents' community affiliation and civic pride remains steadfast.

In memoriam

KATHY BRADSHAW

May 26, 1947 – December 12, 2012. Age 75

athleen Diane Ross Bradshaw lived 75 years supporting her community, friends, and family, before passing away on December 12, 2022. She was my friend and confidant for 52 years, and I continue to miss her every day. She is survived by her children, Carrie, Rick, and Christina Christiansen; 2 grandsons, Noah and James; and her sister, Marsha Nilsson.

Kathy and I met in 1970 on a job in a local doctor's office, and our friendship quickly grew. She originally worked at the Berkeley Free Clinic, serving the health needs of UC Berkeley students. And that was Kathy's calling – the generous helping of others.

Kathy's life was anything but mundane, and to try to organize her life's accomplishments is complicated because she was in more than one place at a time.

Kathy began a formal political career working as a manager for the Republican Party of Northern California. She was the campaign director for various Republican candidates statewide and locally. Kathy planned advance logistics in California for political dignitaries such as President Ronald Reagan, President George H.W. Bush, and U.S. Secretaries of State and National Security Advisors Henry Kissinger and Condoleezza Rice, to name but a few.

A few of her other accomplishments and memberships include:

• Operation Welcome Home -Desert Storm. In 1991 she was a part of programming and organizing the largest parade in Northern California (outside of San Francisco) to welcome home our heroes. Continued on page 7

· She was a member of the Association of Former Intelligence Officers (AFIO); Richmond Unified School District Education Fund, serving on its Board of Directors; and Children's Hospital Medical Center, Live Oak Branch.

· She was Public Affairs Officer for Citizens for Law and Order (CLO) and she spearheaded the Community Fingerprinting Project.

• She was a 39-year member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, and spearheaded the project to put flags on all graves at the veterans cemetery in Dixon for Veterans Day.

· She was also an appointed member of the National Draft Board representing California as part of the Selective Service System.

MORE SERVICE

• Kathy was a scout leader, a volunteer with the West Contra Costa Youth Soccer League (WCCYSL), as well as a member of the Ellerhorst PTA from 1981 through 1991. In 1987, she helped to manage the After-School Enrichment Program, which involved both city and school district funding.

· Kathy was on the Board of the Public Governmental Affairs Community Access TV Commission. Because of her early on involvement, our independent station is still a big part of the City of Pinole.

• She also served on the Pinole Commission on Aging from 1991 through 1992, as well as serving as Chairperson and Co-chairperson the Pinole Memorial Day Parade from 1991–1994.

Continued from page 7 • From 1989 through 1994, she received the Outstanding Service Award from the City of Pinole.

Kathy and her mother, Wauneva Ross, were big supporters of all the programs that were offered for our senior community. Kathy always recognized a "job well done" by volunteers in the community, letting others know how much she appreciated what they did for Pinole. Three such organizations were the Pinole Garden Club, the Pinole Players, and the **Pinole Historical Society:** she was always making generous donations to their fundraising events.

She was a member and co-founder along with her husband, Phil Bradshaw, of the HOTPOP (Homeowners and Taxpayers of Pinole) group, which helped to legally enforce the rights of t axpayers to vote on taxes in Pinole, instead of having a council unilaterally vote for approval without the taxpayers' consent.

In personalizing Kathy's life, I'll tell you some of the behind-thescenes things she did.

While politics was very close to Kathy's heart, people were closer, and she would be proudest to be remembered as a person with a generous character, integrity, and heart.

Several years back, a local woman became engaged to a man joining the military. During his training, he contracted a flesh-eating bacteria. In order to help this man and his fiancée endure what was before him, Kathy covered the costs to fly his fiancée back and forth from home base to whatever military hospital he was in.

In another instance, a Pinole resident had to sell their home to move out of the area. This resident was short of cash to make the transition. Kathy helped meet the financial goal that person needed.

And in other instances, maybe it was just a neighbor's child that needed a little extra encouragement.

She paid for benches on Galbreth Hill, so people might be able to walk the hill and have a place to rest on the way up. She donated to the

Pinole Police Cadet

program, as well as buying a vest for Pinole's first K-9 unit. If you asked, Kathy would provide.

Kathy really loved her community and country. I'm sure many did not know how much Kathy gave of herself, and therefore don't really understand the impact of her passing.

But I do; she was my best friend and confidant and the person I looked to for accolades and criticism. She loved her family, and was so proud of the adults that her children became.

I will honor her memory forever.



- September 8 Pinole Historical Society program -SAN PABLO HISTORIANS TO COMMEMORATE LAND GRANT'S 200TH ANNIVERSARY

Pinole is not the only city commemorating the 200th anniversary of its modern heritage this year.

San Pablo, our neighbor to the west, shares an equally interesting history with Pinole, benefactor of the 1823 El Pinole Grant to Mexican soldier Ygnacio Martínez, which began the early modern history of our city.

This year San Pablo is commemorating the bicentennial of the 1823 Rancho San Pablo land grant, gifted by Governor Luís Antonio Argüello to Francisco María Castro (1775–1831), a former soldier at the San Francisco Presidio and one-time *alcalde* (chief administrative and judicial officer) of the Pueblo of San José.



On Friday, September 8, historians Roxy Miraválle and David Anaya from the San Pablo Historical & Museum Society will present a program about the 17,939-acre grant that eventually encompassed the city of San Pablo, as well as what is now Richmond, El Cerrito, and Kensington.


The public is invited to attend this FREE Pinole Historical Society event at the Pinole Sportsmen's Club, 201 Piñon Avenue. Refreshments will be served.

The land had been grazing land for cattle

belonging to the Misión Dolores, but was secularized by the new Mexican Republic. Francisco Maria Castro lived there with his wife, María Gabriela Berreyesa, and family from the late 1820s until his death in 1831.

Juan Alvarado, governor of Mexican Alta California, married one of the Castro daughters in 1839. After his term as governor was completed, they retired to her family property on Rancho San Pablo.

ABOUT THE PRESENTERS:

Roxy Miraválle, is Director of Historical Research at San Pablo Historical & Museum Society, and Vice President and Director at the El Sobrante Historical Society. She is an historian, author, and genealogist. She has lived in the Bay Area all her life, growing up mainly in San Pablo.

Roxy became interested in local history, started researching Bay Area history, and created a group on social media to share her findings; it has now become her obsession. Doing genealogical research for family trees is another one of her hobbies, which she incorporates into her research of local history.

Roxy contributes many stories about local history in the San Pablo Historical & Museum Society and El Sobrante Historical Society newsletters. **David A. Anaya** is an early California historian and documentary filmmaker born and reared in the Villa de Branciforte, also known as Santa Cruz. He specializes in the early 19th century Spanish and Mexican periods of Alta (not Baja) California histories.

David graduated from California State University-Monterey Bay with a degree in documentary video production. His graduate thesis, "Los Californios de Monterey: Pioneers of Alta California" won several awards, including the CSU (system wide) Student Research award. He sits on the board of the San Pablo Historical Society.

David has produced other early California documentaries, including biographies on Governor Juan B. Alvarado and Dr. John Marsh. He is currently working with the Friends of Joaquin Moraga Adobe in Orinda to produce a short biography video on the life of Joaquin Moraga and his sons for a future adobe exhibit.

His near future projects include a documentary on the Villa de Branciforte, Jose Amesti, and Agustin Zamorano: Alta California's first printer.
